EXECUTIVE ORDER

Solid Waste Advisory Committee

- WHEREAS, Public health hazards and environmental damage persist when hazardous and solid waste materials programs are not carefully planned and managed, and
- Air and water pollution occur as a result of decomposition WHEREAS, processes improperly designed, located and operated. Land use may be adversely affected, and
- WHEREAS. The federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976 Public Law 94-580 requires improved hazardous and solid waste management practices and promotes the recovery of resources from wastes, and
- WHEREAS. Proper management of solid, liquid and sludge wastes requires cooperative efforts of public officials and private entities in the application of available skills and technology in achieving improvements, and
- WHEREAS, Public participation and involvement of local government is a vital activity in the development and implementation of new and improved hazardous and solid waste management systems, and
- WHEREAS, The Colorado Department of Health, on behalf of the Governor, has solicited the view of the informal Solid Waste Advisory Committee, which is constituted by local officials, elected officials, representatives of state government, representatives of industry and other interested parties,

NOW, THEREFORE, it is found necessary to appoint an advisory committee to assist the Colorado Department of Health in planning and recommending appropriate courses of action to me in carrying out the requirements of Public Law 94-580.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado, do hereby form the following Solid Waste Advisory Committee:
