## EXECUTIVE ORDER

### GOVERNOR'S MANSION ADVISORY COMMISSION

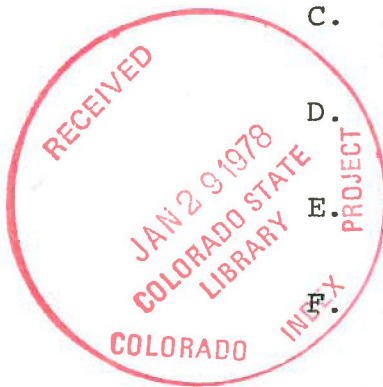
WHEREAS, the Colorado Executive Residence is an historical and public building that should be maintained to ensure an atmosphere of distinction and continuity for the Governors of Colorado; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's Mansion is in need of periodic repair, regular maintenance, and exterior, interior, structural and landscape changes; and

WHEREAS, these repairs and changes should be brought about in a way that provides a concern for historical preservation as residents of the mansion change;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the Laws of the State of Colorado, do hereby order and direct that:


1. That the Governor's Mansion Advisory Commission is hereby created, and shall be under the direction of the Office of the Governor
2. The Commission shall have seven members.
  - A. The membership shall be bipartisan.
  - B. Of those first appointed; one shall serve for a one year term; three shall serve for a two year term; and three shall serve for a three year term.
  - C. Any member will be allowed no more than two reappointments.
  - D. The Director of Administration shall be an ex-officio member.
  - E. The Chairperson will be elected for a two year term by the members of the Commission.
  - F. All members shall be appointed by the Governor from a list of names recommended by the Board of Directors of the State Historical Society. This list shall consist of twice the number as Commission vacancies to be filled.
3. The Commission may meet with ex-officios such as:
  - A. Governor's spouse;
  - B. Residence Manager;
  - C. Director of State Planning and Budgeting;
  - D. Director of Capitol Maintenance and Grounds;
  - E. Professionals and agency personnel as appropriate.

4. The Commission may recommend the appointment of a curator, or other professionals to administer its policies.
5. The Commission shall meet at least three times each year, at intervals of approximately four months, and shall meet within six weeks before the inauguration of each new governor. The Commission may be convened at the request of the Governor.
6. The Commission shall formulate a long-range program for the maintenance of the Governor's Mansion that will:
  - A. Anticipate amjor work necessary to keep the structure and grounds in good repair, and review exterior, interior, structural, and landscape changes;
  - B. Recommend regular and appropriate repairs for furnishings;
  - C. Approve all acquisition of furniture, and proposed changes in decoration of the public rooms;
  - D. Set down guidelines for the public use of the Mansion.
