EXECUTIVE ORDER

COLORADO PRIVATE INDUSTRY COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the participation of private sector employers is necessary for the planning, design and operation of quality employment and training programs; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to determine the demand occupations in growth industries; and

WHEREAS, coordination of employment and training programs with the private sector employers is an important element to the economic development of local communities; and

WHEREAS, Federal regulations encourage coordinated efforts between State and Federal agencies to establish employment training programs with private sector contractors;


NOW THEREFORE, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the Laws of the State of Colorado, do hereby order and direct that:

1. There be hereby created a Colorado Private Industry Council, hereinafter referred to as the Colorado PIC.
2. The Colorado PIC shall receive support services from the Department of Labor and Employment, Branch of State/CETA Unit.
3. The Colorado PIC shall consist of not fewer than fifteen (15) members appointed by the Governor.
4. Members shall be such that one-half the membership shall serve two-year terms and the other half shall serve one-year terms. Vacancies shall be filled as determined in the by-laws.
5. Within 45 days of the issuance of this order, the Colorado PIC shall be responsible for establishing its operating by-laws.
6. The Governor shall appoint a Chairperson pro-tem from the business community until such time as the fully established Colorado PIC can select a Chairperson from its membership who is representative of business and industry.



7. The purpose of the Colorado PIC shall be to:
 - A. Increase the involvement of the business community in the employment and training activities of the Balance of State/CETA Unit by:
 - (1) Presenting the private sector's recommendations for making programs more responsive to local employment needs, and
 - (2) Advising Balance of State/CETA as to ways of increasing private sector job placements;
 - B. Assist with design and development of the Title VII Program by:
 - (1) Providing an analysis of private sector job opportunities by occupation, industry and location;
 - (2) Exploring training possibilities that meet long and short term local employment demands, and
 - (3) Establishing specific private sector employment and training project;
 - (4) Encourage a coordinated effort among the private sector for training and employment in communities that are targeted economic growth areas.
 - C. Provide, on a continuing basis, a review and assessment of the activities of the Title VII Program;
 - D. Coordinate planning efforts with local community development groups and other State agencies involved in the economic development of Colorado communities.
8. Unless otherwise authorized by renewal of Executive Order or legislative action, this Order shall expire September 30, 1981.
