EXECUTIVE ORDER

Creating the Blue Ribbon Citizen's Committee
for the

Long Range Rocky Flats Utilization Study

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WHEREAS, the Department of Energy is conducting an extensive study on the long range utilization of DOE's Rocky Flats facility; and

WHEREAS, the DOE study will include issues relating to the possible modification and/or relocation of some or all of Rocky Flats operations; and

WHEREAS, an independent evaluation of the study and its conclusions is of importance to the DOE and to the people living in the Denver metropolitan area; and

WHEREAS, recommendation 3A of the Rocky Flats Task Force created in 1975 by Governor Lamm and Congressman Wirth recommended that the Congress and the President undertake a re-evaluation of the long term future of Rocky Flats; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has approved the request to provide funds to support the work of the Blue Ribbon Citizen's Committee;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado, under the authority vested in me by the constitution and statutes of the State of Colorado, do HEREBY ORDER THAT:

1. The Blue Ribbon Citizen's Committee for the Long Range Rocky Flats Utilization Study (BRC) previously established by the joint action of Congressman Wirth and me, is hereby created as a temporary commission, operating out of the office of the Governor.
2. The BRC shall conduct independent oversight, review and comment on the DOE study, and shall develop appropriate procedures and organization for these purposes. Such procedures

should include at least the following:

- a. Independent review and evaluation of the scope of the study to ensure that all pertinent issues are addressed;
 - b. Independent review and evaluation of the technical and socio-economic outputs to assure that they are thorough, complete and objective;
 - c. Periodic reporting to me, Congressman Wirth, and the general public; and
 - d. A final, written evaluation of the DOE study, including committee conclusions and recommendations, to be broadly distributed to local, state, and federal agencies and to the general public.
3. The BRC shall hire a full-time director and other appropriate staff and otherwise shall expend funds only as may be available under the FEMA grant, unless additional funds become available. All expenditures shall be under the administrative supervision of my office.


