EXECUTIVE ORDER

SOLAR ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO THE COLORADO OFFICE OF ENERGY CONSERVATION

WHEREAS, solar energy is becoming an increasingly important segment of Colorado's economy; and

WHEREAS, the decentralized and diverse nature of solar energy technologies makes it necessary to involve a broad-based cross-section of private sector expertise in effective solar energy commercialization planning; and

WHEREAS, on October 12, 1978, a Solar Advisory Committee to the Office of Energy Conservation was established by Executive Order and was extended for two years October 13, 1980, Executive Order #B1280, and has since terminated;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the laws of the State of Colorado, do hereby order and direct that effective immediately:

1. The Solar Advisory Committee to the Office of Energy Conservation be reestablished.
2. The Governor shall appoint no more than 25 members to serve at the pleasure of the Governor.
3. The members shall be representative of diverse geographic regions in the state, diverse expertise areas in solar technologies, including wind and bio-fuels, and diverse professional affiliations, interests, income levels and backgrounds.
4. The functions of the Committee shall include:
 - a. Review and evaluation of solar energy programs conducted by the Office of Energy Conservation.
 - b. Review and recommendation on new programs, administrative guidelines, priorities, and such other matters as may be determined by the chairperson.
5. The Solar Advisory Committee shall be terminated not later than two years from the date of this order, unless renewed by the Governor by appropriate action prior to the expiration of the two-year period.
