EXECUTIVE ORDER

COLORADO COMMISSION ON CHILD SUPPORT

- WHEREAS, the State of Colorado has established a Child Support Enforcement Program Pursuant of Title IV, Part D of the Social Security Act of 1975; and
- WHEREAS, the Colorado Child Support Commission created pursuant to Executive Order B 008 84 has completed its study of the state child support system and submitted to the Governor a full and complete report of its findings and recommendations resulting from this study; and
- WHEREAS, additional study is necessary to develop and refine the Commission's recommendations and to explore funding mechanisms for the improvement of the Colorado child support system;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the laws of the State of Colorado, DO HEREBY ORDER THAT:

- 1. There is created a Colorado Commission on Child Support (hereinafter known as the Commission), which shall consist of at least 17 but no more than 20 members. The Commission shall be composed of members with interest in and knowledge of the area of child support. The chair of the Commission and the members shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Governor. Commission members shall receive no compensation for their services in performance of their official duties. Any member of the Commission may be removed by the Governor for cause.
- 2. The Commission shall meet at times and places as designated by the chair, but in no event less than monthly. Technical and clerical staff assistance shall be provided by the State Department of Social Services, by individual board members and by other board-specified sources.

- 3. The Commission shall perform the following functions:
 - a. Examine, investigate, and study interstate enforcement mechanisms.
 - b. Further develop and refine the Commission's recommendations of the Family Law Court system and the State Office of Enforcement.
 - c. Examine, investigate, and study funding mechanisms to have the Colorado child support system pay its own way to impose no additional burden upon the taxpayers.
 - d. Submit to the Governor, and make available to the public, no later than December 31, 1986, a full and complete report of its findings and recommendations resulting from this study.
- 4. This Commission shall be terminated no later than December 31, 1986, unless renewed by appropriate action of the Governor prior to that date.
- 5. This Executive Order shall be effective immediately and supercedes any previous executive orders relating to or establishing a Colorado Commission on Child Support.
