EXECUTIVE ORDER EMERGENCY PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, on the fourth day of May, 1979, I exercised my authority under C.R.S. 1973, 24-20-108, and issued an Emergency Proclamation prohibiting further construction and other activities related to the Gold Run residential apartment buildings within and adjacent to the floodway on the south side of Boulder Creek between 28th and 30th streets in The City of Boulder; and

WHEREAS, that emergency proclamation and order was effective on May 5, 1979, and, by statute, will expire on May 20, 1979, unless extended by me for an additional 15-day period; and

WHEREAS, State officials and representatives of Sherrelwood, Inc., developer of the Gold Run apartments, recently met and agreed to a timetable for constructing and completing various engineering studies and analysis concerning the flood hazards related to the Gold Run apartments; and

WHEREAS, the principals of Sherrelwood, Inc., have agreed to hold in abeyance further construction, application for occupancy permits, and application for building permits for the Gold Run apartments until completion of this process; and


WHEREAS, based upon these contracts, there is no need to extend the emergency proclamation of May 4, 1979, at this time;

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me by C.R.S. 1973, 24-20-108, I do hereby order that:

1. The emergency order of May 4, 1979, will not be extended at this time for an additional 15-day period, contingent upon Sherrelwood, Inc., adhering to its commitments outlined above; and
2. I reserve the right to extend the emergency proclamation of May 19, 1979, for an additional 15-day period, at a later date, if such action becomes necessary to present a significant risk of serious danger to the public health.
