## EXECUTIVE ORDER

WHEREAS, the Sheriff of Weld County and the Police Chief for the City of Greeley have requested the assistance of the Colorado State Patrol regarding an emergency situation; and

WHEREAS, such emergency situation relates to a labor dispute in and around Greeley, Colorado; and

WHEREAS, the Colorado State Patrol is prohibited from serving or acting on strike duty, lockouts, or other labor disputes by C.R.S. 1973, 43-5-113(3);

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the laws of the State of Colorado, do hereby order and direct that:

1. Pursuant to the provisions of C.R.S. 1973, 43-5-113(3), I hereby approve of all officers of the Colorado State Patrol, with the approval of the Chief of the Colorado State Patrol or his designee, assisting the Weld County Sheriff and the Greeley Police in responding only to emergency matters not related to a labor dispute on Monday, January 14, 1980.
2. All officers of the Colorado State Patrol are hereby directed to remain at least one-half mile away from the perimeter of the Monfort packing plant which is located in and around the City of Greeley.
3. The Colorado State Patrol is authorized to assist only in the rerouting of traffic in case either the Greeley Police or the Weld County Sheriff erect roadblocks on public highways leading into the Monfort packing plant.
4. The Colorado State Patrol shall not become involved in any manner whatsoever with the labor dispute at the Monfort plant.
5. This order supercedes any other applicable executive orders authorizing the Colorado State Patrol to assist the Weld County Sheriff or the Greeley Police for the period in which this order is in effect.
