EXECUTIVE ORDER PROCLAMATION

DISASTER EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, on April 30, 1980, severe damages from flood waters occurred in Larimer County, Colorado; and

WHEREAS, increased damage will occur during the Spring snowpack runoff if emergency repairs are not made in a timely fashion; and

WHEREAS, the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners of Larimer County on May 3, 1980, did declare that a state of disaster emergency existed in that county; and

WHEREAS, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor, do find that the aforementioned conditions constitute a threat to the safety and welfare of the State, and create a disaster emergency within the meaning of Section 28-2-104 of the Colorado Disaster Emergency Act of 1973;

NOW, THEREFORE, under powers vested in me under Section 28-2-104 of the Disaster Emergency Act of 1973, and other enabling provisions, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado, do hereby declare Larimer County to be a disaster area, entitled to aid, relief, and assistance.

NOW, THEREFORE, I direct the Division of Disaster Emergency Services, assisted by State departments and agencies it designates, to assess the need for emergency action to:

- (1) Restore public services and facilities; and
- (2) Reduce threats to public health and safety; and
- (3) Restore river channel integrity to prevent continuing or additional damage.

NOW, THEREFORE, I further direct appropriate State departments and agencies to take expeditious action to complete projects identified as required by this assessment process.

THIS PROCLAMATION shall expire after thirty (30) days, unless otherwise extended by the Governor.
