## EXECUTIVE ORDER PROCLAMATION

### EXTENDING FLOOD DISASTER DECLARATION FOR LARIMER COUNTY

WHEREAS, severe rains which began on April 30, 1980, resulted in flooding in Larimer, Weld, Logan, Morgan, Sedgwick and Washington Counties; and

WHEREAS, in response to said flooding, by Proclamation dated May 10, 1980, Larimer County was declared to be a disaster area, entitled to aid, relief, and assistance; and

WHEREAS, by Proclamation dated May 30, 1980, said state of disaster emergency was enlarged to include Weld, Logan, Morgan, Sedgwick, and Washington Counties; and

WHEREAS, said state of disaster emergency expires after thirty (30) days unless otherwise extended by the Governor; and


WHEREAS, the proclamation dated May 30, 1980, including the proclamation of May 10, 1980, was extended to August 29, 1980 by orders dated June 30, 1980, and July 30, 1980; and

WHEREAS, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor, do find that the aforementioned state of disaster emergency has not been dealt with to the extent that emergency conditions no longer exist within the meaning of CRS 1973, 28-2-104 of the Colorado Disaster Emergency Act of 1973;

NOW, THEREFORE, under powers vested in me under CRS 1973, 28-2-104 of the Disaster Emergency Act of 1973, and other enabling provisions, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado do hereby renew my proclamation of May 30, 1980, including the proclamation of May 10, 1980, as previously extended, for an additional thirty (30) days, until September 28, 1980.
