TRANSFERRING TEMPORARILY THE EMPLOYEES OF THE
OFFICE OF ENERGY CONSERVATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF REGULATORY AGENCIES

- WHEREAS, I created the Office of Energy Conservation (OEC) by executive order dated August 10, 1977; and
- WHEREAS, during the three years of its operation under executive authority, the OEC performed outstanding service to the people and State of Colorado on numerous energy conservation matters; and
- WHEREAS, the General Assembly recognized and affirmed the importance of the OEC by extending the office statutorily through Senate Bill 131 during the 1980 legislative session; and
- WHEREAS, under the statute, the OEC would be transferred from the Governor's Office to the Office of the Director, Department of Regulatory Agencies, effective July 1, 1981; and
- WHEREAS, the important mission of the OEC requires that the transfer occur smoothly and efficiently; and
- WHEREAS, a smooth transition can be assured by creating working conditions designed to facilitate such transfer; and
- WHEREAS, the temporary transfer of OEC employees to the office of the Director, Department of Regulatory Agencies, will provide the particular working conditions required to facilitate and enhance the formal transfer of OEC and will allow the Director to develop the necessary administrative and organizational relationship with the OEC;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado, pursuant to my authority under the constitution of the State of Colorado and under the authority set forth in C.R.S. 1973, 24-2-107, DO HEREBY ORDER THAT:

The employees of the Office of Energy Conservation be transferred temporarily to the Office of the Director, Department of Regulatory Agencies, for administrative assistance and supervision until June 30, 1981.
