EXECUTIVE ORDER

TERMINATING HUMAN SETTLEMENT POLICIES

WHEREAS, rapid population and economic growth require the State of Colorado to allocate limited resources according to clearly stated plans, policies and priorities; and

WHEREAS, on September 13, 1979, I issued Executive Order D0018-79 establishing such plans, policies and priorities for state departments; and

WHEREAS, members of the General Assembly have expressed strong desires to have legislative involvement in the creation of such plans, policies and priorities; and


WHEREAS, cooperation between the executive and legislative branches of state government is an important element in developing and implementing such plans, policies and priorities in an effective manner;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the constitution and statutes of the State of Colorado, do HEREBY ORDER THAT:

1. The provisions of Executive Order D0018-79 shall terminate on December 31, 1980.
2. This administration will cooperate fully with the General Assembly in making earnest and responsible efforts to develop appropriate plans, policies and priorities for the allocation of state resources which will enable the State of Colorado to maximize the benefits and minimize the detriments of rapid population and economic growth in this state.
