EXECUTIVE ORDER PROCLAMATION DISASTER EMERGENCY IN OURAY COUNTY

WHEREAS, Cascade Creek and Portland Creek in Ouray County have caused flooding conditions to exist in the City of Ouray since August 20, 1982; and

WHEREAS, said flooding resulted in significant damage to public and private property in the City of Ouray; and

WHEREAS, the threat of additional flooding exists in Ouray County with resultant property damage and threat to life; and

WHEREAS, immediate attention is required to protect public health, to reduce further damage, to ensure public safety, and to render emergency relief; and


WHEREAS, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor, do find that the aforementioned conditions constitute a threat to the public safety and welfare of the people of the State of Colorado, and create a disaster emergency situation within the meaning of Section 28-2-104 of the Colorado Disaster Emergency Act of 1973;

NOW, THEREFORE, under the powers vested in me under Section 28-4-104 of the Colorado Disaster Emergency Act of 1973, and other enabling provisions, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado, DO HEREBY DECLARE that a state of disaster emergency exists in Ouray County, for the reasons set forth above, and that the aforementioned disaster area is entitled to aid, relief and assistance pursuant to the Colorado Disaster Emergency Act of 1973.

This proclamation shall expire after thirty (30) days, unless otherwise extended.
