EXECUTIVE ORDER

CONDITION OF CAPITOL COMPLEX BUILDINGS

WHEREAS, the state's budget problems over the last several years have resulted in the delay of renovation and repair of state buildings; and

WHEREAS, because the condition of the major buildings in the Capitol Complex has continued to deteriorate, an independent group of architects, engineers and fire prevention specialists was commissioned to ascertain the exact condition of most of the buildings in the Capitol Complex; and

WHEREAS, this group made numerous recommendations for repair and rehabilitation of buildings in the Capitol Complex; and


WHEREAS, I recognize the current state budget crisis precludes full implementation of the recommendations of this group during the current and next fiscal year;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the laws of the State of Colorado, DO HEREBY DIRECT in the interest of the safety, health, productivity and comfort of the state employees who work in these buildings and the citizens who must visit the above buildings on official state business, that:

1. The renovation and repair of the buildings in the Capitol Complex will be the subject of major capital construction budget requests during the next several fiscal years and these items will be among the highest priorities in the Governor's Budget.
2. The State Office Building, as the building needing the most urgent renovation and repair, will be vacated as soon as possible, and that the tenants therein of the Department of Education and Department of Regulatory Agencies will be located elsewhere until funds can be appropriated and necessary repairs completed.

This Order shall be effective immediately.
