EXECUTIVE ORDER

ENTRY PERMITS FOR CATTLE AMENDING PREVIOUS EXECUTIVE ORDER

I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado, do hereby amend the resolved clause of the Executive Order, dated the fourteenth day of February, A.D. 1978, and amended the fifth day of October, 1979; which pertains to entry permits for cattle into this state to read as follows:

All cattle consigned to Colorado from any point outside the State of Colorado designated by the Colorado State Veterinarian as a high risk scabies area shall be accompanied by an entry permit issued by the Colorado Department of Agriculture. The permit must accompany the shipment in addition to an official health certificate from state of origin of the cattle certifying that the cattle have been officially treated with a scabicide approved by the United States Department of Agriculture within 10 days of shipment; or the cattle may be moved under permit from the Colorado State Veterinarian's office to a certified treatment facility within Colorado for official treatment within 24 hours of arrival or at the first unloading point, whichever occurs first. Interstate cattle shall not be mixed with or allowed to intermingle with resident cattle upon arrival and prior to official treatment. The only exceptions to this Order are:

1. Cattle consigned directly to a federal inspected slaughter establishment for immediate slaughter (24 hours) in which case only an entry permit is required.
2. Cattle consigned to livestock markets shall be treated prior to leaving the livestock market facilities unless positively identified and consigned directly to a federally inspected slaughter facility within 24 hours or on the next working day; or moved directly under market scabies release to a purchaser's premises which have APPROVED dipping facilities (approved by the State Veterinarians) to be dipped within 24 hours after arrival and before being mixed with other cattle. All animals shipped on the truck under this exception must be going to the same premises and be dipped.
3. Lactating dairy cows shall not be intermingled or mixed with any other cattle until a visual inspection by a Colorado Department of Agriculture official shall certify the animal is free of scabies by inspection.

4. Special commuter permits may be issued by the Colorado State Veterinarian for closed cow herds and their produce to move without treatment for scabies if they are moved in the course of normal ranching operations without change of ownership and to a premise under the same ownership. They must have a scabies inspection and have a certificate stating that they show no evidence of scabies.
5. Special exemptions made by the Colorado State Veterinarian in cases where the introduction of scabies is not a risk.

FURTHER, I do provide that this Executive Order shall remain in full force and effect until revoked by subsequent Executive Order and shall take effect immediately.
