EXECUTIVE ORDER PROCLAMATION

DISASTER EMERGENCY IN DELTA, MESA AND MONTROSE COUNTIES, AND THE TOWN OF OAK CREEK IN ROUTT COUNTY

WHEREAS, spring snowmelt has caused flooding conditions to exist in Delta, Mesa and Montrose Counties, and the Town of Oak Creek in Routt County, since May 14, 1984; and

WHEREAS, said flooding has resulted in significant damage to public and private property in Delta, Mesa and Montrose Counties, and the Town of Oak Creek in Routt County; and


WHEREAS, the threat of additional flooding exists in Delta, Mesa and Montrose Counties, and the Town of Oak Creek in Routt County; and

WHEREAS, immediate assistance is required to protect public health, to reduce further damage, to ensure public safety, and to render emergency relief;

NOW, THEREFORE I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado, under the powers vested in me under Section 28-2-104 of the Colorado Disaster Emergency Act of 1973, DO HEREBY DECLARE that a state of emergency exists in Delta, Mesa and Montrose Counties, and the Town of Oak Creek in Routt County, for the reasons set forth above, and that the aforementioned areas within the state are entitled to aid, relief and assistance, pursuant to the Colorado Disaster Emergency Act of 1973, and as may be available under the provisions of federal law.

This Executive Order shall expire after thirty (30) days, unless otherwise extended.
