EXECUTIVE ORDER PROCLAMATION

DENVER

EXTENDING DISASTER EMERGENCY IN DELTA, MESA AND MONTROSE COUNTIES, AND THE TOWN OF OAK CREEK IN ROUTT COUNTY

- WHEREAS, spring snowmelt has caused flooding conditions to exist in Delta, Mesa and Montrose Counties, and the Town of Oak Creek in Routt County, Colorado since May 14, 1984; and
- WHEREAS, in response to the aforesaid conditions, a state of disaster emergency was declared to exist in Delta, Mesa and Montrose Counties and the Town of Oak Creek in Routt County, Colorado by Proclamation effective May 23, 1984 and extended by executive order dated June 27, 1984;
- WHEREAS, the said state of disaster emergency expires after thirty (30) days unless otherwise extended by the Governor; and
- WHEREAS, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado, do find that the aforementioned state of disaster emergency has not been dealt with to the extent that emergency conditions no longer exist within the meaning of C.R.S. 24-33.5-704;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado, pursuant to the authority vested in me under Section 24-33.5-704, and other enabling provisions, DO HEREBY renew my proclamation of June 27, 1984 for an additional thirty (30) days.
