EXECUTIVE ORDER

EXTENDING DISASTER EMERGENCY IN MOFFAT, RIO BLANCO, SAN MIGUEL, OURAY, EAGLE AND PITKIN COUNTIES

WHEREAS, spring snowmelt has caused flooding conditions to exist in Moffat, Rio Blanco, San Miguel, Ouray, Eagle and Pitkin Counties in Colorado since July 13, 1984; and

WHEREAS, in response to the aforesaid conditions, a state of disaster emergency was declared to exist in Moffat, Rio Blanco, San Miguel, Ouray, Eagle and Pitkin Counties in Colorado by Proclamation effective July 13, 1984; and

WHEREAS, the said state of disaster emergency expires after thirty (30) days unless otherwise extended by the Governor; and

WHEREAS, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado, do find that the aforementioned state of disaster emergency has not been dealt with to the extent that emergency conditions no longer exist within the meaning of C.R.S. 24-33.5-704;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado, pursuant to the authority vested in me under Section 24-33.5-704, and other enabling provisions, DO HEREBY renew my proclamation of July 13, 1984, for an additional thirty (30) days.
