EXECUTIVE ORDER PROCLAMATION

RICHARD D. LAMM

EXTENDING DISASTER EMERGENCY IN DELTA, MESA AND MONTROSE COUNTIES, AND THE TOWN OF OAK CREEK IN ROUTT COUNTY

WHEREAS, spring snowmelt has caused flooding conditions to exist in Delta, Mesa and Montrose Counties, and the Town of Oak Creek in Routt County, Colorado, since May 14, 1984; and


WHEREAS, in response to the aforesaid conditions, a state of disaster emergency was declared to exist in Delta, Mesa and Montrose Counties and the Town of Oak Creek in Routt County, Colorado, by Proclamation effective May 23, 1984, and extended by executive orders dated June 27, 1984, July 23, 1984, and August 27, 1984; and

WHEREAS, the said state of disaster emergency expires after thirty (30) days unless otherwise extended by the Governor; and

WHEREAS, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado, do find that the aforementioned state of disaster emergency has not been dealt with to the extent that emergency conditions no longer exist within the meaning of C.R.S. 24-33.5-704;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado, pursuant to the authority vested in me under Section 24-33.5-704, and other enabling provisions, DO HEREBY renew my proclamation of August 27, 1984, nunc pro tunc to August 23, 1984, for an additional thirty (30) days.
