EXECUTIVE ORDER PROCLAMATION DISASTER EMERGENCY IN DOLORES COUNTY AND THE TOWN OF DOVE CREEK

WHEREAS, heavy rains on August 16, 1984, caused severe flooding, mudslides and landslides in Dolores County and the Town of Dove Creek; and

WHEREAS, said flooding and slides resulted in significant damage to public property in Dolores County and the Town of Dove Creek; and

WHEREAS, the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners of Dolores County on August 20, 1984, and the Mayor of the Town of Dove Creek on August 21, 1984, declared that a state of emergency existed in the county and town; and


WHEREAS, the President of the United States declared Dolores County a major disaster area for the period of May 1, 1984, to June 30, 1984, due to flooding conditions caused by spring snowmelt; and

WHEREAS, immediate assistance is required to protect public health, to reduce further damage, to ensure public safety, and to render emergency relief;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado, under the powers vested in me under 24-33.5-704, DO HEREBY DECLARE that a state of emergency exists in Dolores County and the Town of Dove Creek in Colorado, for the reasons set forth above, and that the aforementioned areas within the state are entitled to aid, relief and assistance, pursuant to the Colorado Disaster Emergency Act, and as may be available under the provisions of federal law.

This Executive Order shall expire after thirty (30) days, unless otherwise extended.
