### EXTENDING DISASTER EMERGENCY IN SILT, GARFIELD COUNTY, COLORADO

WHEREAS, flooding of the Colorado River, which began on May 18, 1984, has impacted the Town of Silt in Garfield County; and


WHEREAS, in response to the aforesaid conditions, a state of disaster emergency was declared to exist in the Town of Silt, Garfield County, Colorado, by Proclamation dated May 18, 1984, and extended by Executive Orders dated June 20, 1984; July 23, 1984; August 27, 1984; September 18, 1984; October 18, 1984; November 19, 1984; December 19, 1984; January 18, 1985; February 27, 1985; March 25, 1985; April 29, 1985; May 31, 1985; July 29, 1985, nunc pro tunc to June 17, 1985; July 29, 1985, nunc pro tunc to July 17, 1985; August 16, 1985; October 16, 1985, nunc pro tunc to September 16, 1985; October 16, 1985, nunc pro tunc to October 15, 1985; December 3, 1985, nunc pro tunc to November 14, 1985; December 14, 1985; January 13, 1986; February 10, 1986; March 7, 1986; April 11, 1986; May 9, 1986; June 6, 1986; July 3, 1986; and

WHEREAS, the said state of disaster emergency expires after thirty (30) days unless otherwise extended by the Governor; and

WHEREAS, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor, do find that the aforementioned state of disaster emergency has not been dealt with to the extent that emergency conditions no longer exist within the meaning of C.R.S. 24-33.5-704;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Richard D. Lamm, Governor of the State of Colorado, pursuant to the authority vested in me under C.R.S. 24-33.5-704, and other enabling provisions, DO HEREBY renew my Proclamation of May 18, 1984, for an additional thirty (30) days.
