**EXECUTIVE ORDER
PROCLAIMING**

DISASTER EMERGENCY IN PARK COUNTY

WHEREAS, spring snowmelt resulting from unusually warm spring temperatures commencing on April 17, 1987 has caused severe flooding conditions to exist in Park County in the State of Colorado.

WHEREAS, that flooding has resulted in severe damage to public property and the imminent threat of widespread and severe damage, injury and loss of life and property;

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Park County has by resolution declared a state of emergency to exist in Park County and has requested assistance from the State of Colorado;

WHEREAS, immediate assistance is required to protect public health, to reduce further damage, to ensure public safety, and to render emergency relief;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Roy Romer, Governor of the State of Colorado, under the authority vested in me under Section 24-33.5-704 of the Colorado Disaster Emergency Act of 1973, proclaim that a state of emergency exists in Park County for the reasons set forth above and that Park County is entitled to aid, relief and assistance pursuant to the Colorado Disaster Emergency Act of 1973, and as may be available under the provisions of federal law.

This Executive Order shall expire after thirty (30) days, unless otherwise extended.
