## EXECUTIVE ORDER

## COMMUTATION OF SENTENCE

JAMES DEVINE, DOC Registry #103054999, was sentenced by the District Court of the City and County of Denver and received at the Colorado State Penitentiary on June 13, 1986, to serve 2 years and 3 years, consecutively, for the crimes of First Degree Criminal Trespass and Attempt to Escape.

After review and deliberation of his application for clemency, I have decided to extend executive clemency to Mr. Devine for the following reasons:

1. The Certificate of Conduct states that JAMES DEVINE has maintained good behavior;
2. The medical staff for the Department of Corrections has examined Mr. Devine and determined that Mr. Devine has cancer and the prognosis of his surviving beyond one year is poor;
3. The Department of Corrections' Medical Staff and the Executive Director of the Department of Corrections recommend that the sentence of JAMES DEVINE be commuted for compassionate reasons due to his terminal medical status;
4. It is deemed that the interests of all concerned will be best served by a commutation of sentence.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED:

That the minimum sentence of JAMES DEVINE, DOC 103054999, be commuted to time served with no changes in the maximum resulting in his eligibility for immediate release. The Department of Corrections may consider other factors authorized by law in addition to this commute in determining the final parole release date.
