## EXECUTIVE ORDER

### TRANSFER OF FUNDS FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TO THE COLORADO DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL AFFAIRS

WHEREAS, the Department of Health and Human Services is the recipient of funds under the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Act of 1981 (P.L. 97-35); hereafter referred to as the Low-Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP); and

WHEREAS, the Colorado Department of Social Services is the recipient of funds for the LIEAP Program; and

WHEREAS, the Low-Income Energy Assistance Act of 1981 allows up to fifteen (15) percent of the funds to be used for low cost residential weatherization or other energy related home repair for low income households; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the provision of low cost residential weatherization services will provide long range benefits for Colorado's low income population; and

WHEREAS, the Division of Housing in the Colorado Department of Local Affairs has experience in providing low cost weatherization services to low income populations; and

WHEREAS, the Division of Housing in the Colorado Department of Local Affairs is best able to use the weatherization funds to serve Colorado's low income population;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Roy Romer, Governor of the State of Colorado, pursuant to the authority vested in me under the Constitution and laws of the State of Colorado, DO HEREBY ORDER THAT:

1. The Colorado Department of Local Affairs is designated as the responsible agency to administer a low cost weatherization program;
2. The Low Cost Weatherization Program shall be administered in accordance with all federal laws and regulations;

3. The Department of Local Affairs shall receive \$3,590,908 from the Colorado Department of Social Services, including \$234,919 for administrative costs and \$3,355,989 for weatherization services.
