PROCLAMATION

DECLARING A DISASTER EMERGENCY IN LINCOLN COUNTY AND ORDERING TO STATE ACTIVE DUTY THE COLORADO NATIONAL GUARD

WHEREAS, on Wednesday evening, June 6, 1990, a tornado struck the community of Limon, Colorado;

WHEREAS, I inspected the scene of the tornado on Wednesday evening, June 6, and Thursday morning, June 7, 1990, and witnessed that the tornado had caused injuries to people in the area and caused extensive property damage including the total destruction of many residences and businesses within the Town of Limon;

WHEREAS, a disaster emergency exists in Lincoln County and in the Town of Limon; and

WHEREAS, it became obvious to me on the evening of June 6 that a disaster emergency in Lincoln County required the use of the Colorado National Guard;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Roy Romer, Governor of the State of Colorado, under the authority vested in me under the Constitution and laws of the State of Colorado DO HEREBY ORDER:

1. Under Section 24-33.5-704, C.R.S., of the Colorado Disaster Emergency Act of 1973, I proclaim that a state of disaster emergency exists in Lincoln County for the reasons set forth above, and that Lincoln County is entitled to aid, relief and assistance pursuant to the Colorado Disaster Emergency Act of 1973;
2. Under the provisions of Section 28-3-104, C.R.S., I confirm my order of the evening of June 6, 1990 to the Colorado National Guard, and require the Adjutant General to order persons to state active duty with pay for the protection of life and property in Lincoln County. The Adjutant General shall determine the number of individuals assigned to this duty, and equipment deployed on this matter as needed to provide assistance to the Town of Limon and Lincoln County;
