EXECUTIVE ORDER

CHANGE IN TERMS FOR OIL OVERCHARGE FUNDS TO STATES
AS A RESULT OF THE DECISIONS AND ORDERS OF THE
STRIPPER WELL EXEMPTION LITIGATION, CASE M.D.L. #378

WHEREAS, Colorado has received \$12,060,162.15 to date under the provisions of the Settlement Agreement and Order in the Stripper Well Exemption Litigation, M.D.L. #378;


WHEREAS, \$7,817,706 was originally allocated by Executive Order D0097 86, dated September 30, 1986, and amended by Executive Orders D0126 86, dated December 23, 1986; D0057 87, dated December 16, 1987; D0060 88, dated January 20, 1988; D0086 88, dated September 6, 1988; D0096 88, dated October 17, 1988; D0116 89, dated April 25, 1989; and D0121 89, dated May 30, 1989;

WHEREAS, there is a need to amend the terms of these Executive Orders;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Roy Romer, Governor of the State of Colorado, pursuant to the Settlement Agreement and Order of the U.S. District Court for the District of Kansas in Case M.D.L. #378, DO HEREBY ORDER THAT the above referenced Executive Orders be amended with the following additions:

1. \$295,000 shall be allocated to the previously funded Joint Center for Energy Management to continue their energy program;
2. \$272,736 shall be allocated to the Colorado Office of Energy Conservation to continue the previously funded solid waste reduction/management program;
3. \$25,000 shall be allocated to the Regional Air Quality Council to continue the projects of the previously-funded Metropolitan Air Quality Council;
4. \$114,500 shall be allocated to the Colorado Office of Energy Conservation to continue the regulatory advocacy program for the purposes of conducting an energy efficiency incentive for utility companies.
