PROCLAMATION
CERTIFYING VOTE ON CERTAIN MEASURES

WHEREAS, certain measures were referred to or initiated by the people of the State of Colorado at the general election on November 6, 1990;

WHEREAS, Secretary of State Natalie Meyer on December 24, 1990, certified to me that certain of those measures were approved by a majority of the votes cast;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Roy Romer, Governor of the State of Colorado, pursuant to Article V, Section 1, of the Constitution of the State of Colorado, proclaim and officially declare that the vote on those measures was as follows:

Amendments to the Constitution and Laws of the State of Colorado, Initiated, Referred and Voted on at the General Election, November 6, 1990.

1. Shall there be an amendment to Article X of the Colorado Constitution to require voter approval for certain state and local government revenue increases; to restrict property, income, and other taxes; to limit the rate of increase in state spending; to change property valuation and assessment laws; and to provide for additional initiative and referendum elections and for the mailing of information to registered voters?

2. Shall the State of Colorado conduct a presidential primary election which conforms to political party rules at which electors shall cast votes for qualified candidates of their political party, and the results of which may be used by political parties to allocate delegates to national political conventions for the

selection of a presidential candidate at such convention?

3. An amendment to Articles IV, VII, XI, XII, XIII, and XVIII of the Constitution of the State of Colorado, concerning the repeal of obsolete constitutional provisions.


4. Shall there be an amendment to the Colorado Constitution legalizing limited gaming in the cities of Black Hawk, Central, and Cripple Creek?

5. Shall there be an amendment to the Colorado Constitution limiting the number of consecutive terms that may be served by the Governor, Lt. Governor, Secretary of State, Attorney General, Treasurer, Members of the General Assembly, and United States Senators and Representatives elected from Colorado?
