EXECUTIVE ORDER

AMENDING EXECUTIVE ORDER D0012 92  
REGARDING  
DISTRIBUTION OF EXXON OIL OVERCHARGE FUNDS UNDER THE  
JUDGEMENT AND ORDER OF THE UNITED STATES DISTRICT COURT  
FOR THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA OF JUNE 7, 1983

WHEREAS, Colorado was allocated \$22,715,814 under the provisions of the Exxon case;

WHEREAS, those funds were originally allocated by Executive Order D0092 86, dated September 4, 1986, and amended by Executive Orders D0126 86, dated December 23, 1986; D0057 87, dated December 16, 1987; D0014 89, dated March 31, 1989; D0016 89, dated April 25, 1989; D0148 89, dated October 5, 1989; D0027 90, dated August 7, 1990; and B023 91, dated August 9, 1991; D0012 92 dated May 6, 1992; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to amend the terms of these Executive Orders;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Roy Romer, Governor of Colorado, under the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the State of Colorado, and pursuant to the Judgement and Order of the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia, do hereby order that:

1. \$60,000 shall be allocated to the Energy in Community Development Program for grants to energy efficient model communities.
2. \$289,642 shall be allocated to the Colorado Office of Energy Conservation for the renewable resource program.
3. \$24,646 shall be allocated to continue the Energy Conservation in Purchasing program to be performed in conjunction with the Colorado Division of Purchasing.

4. \$26,636 shall be allocated to the Colorado Office of Energy Conservation for the small business energy management program.
5. \$500,000 shall be allocated to the Alternative Fuels program.
6. \$70,000 shall be allocated to the Agricultural Energy Conservation program.
