Lisa Miller, MD, MSPH, is the acting chief medical officer at the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, where she is responsible for supervision of health-related divisions, including Disease Control and Environmental Epidemiology, Prevention Services, Health Facilities and Emergency Medical Services, Laboratory Services, the Center for Health and Environmental Information and Statistics, and Emergency Preparedness and Response. She also supervises the Office of Health Disparities.

Dr. Miller also is director of the Disease Control and Environmental Epidemiology Division. There she directs programs concerning surveillance and prevention of HIV and sexually transmitted diseases, tuberculosis, vaccine-preventable diseases, viral hepatitis, general communicable diseases, childhood lead poisoning, birth defects, emergency preparedness, and assessments of the health impact from environmental exposures.

Dr. Miller is the medical director of Colorado Responds to Children with Special Needs, Colorado's birth defects monitoring and prevention program. She is particularly involved in autism and muscular dystrophy surveillance and research.

Dr. Miller received a bachelor's degree in consumer food science from the University of Minnesota in 1985, an M.D. degree from the University of Minnesota in 1989, and a master's of science in public health from the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center in 1993. She is board certified in general preventive medicine and is an adjoint assistant professor in the University of Colorado Denver's Department of Pediatrics and School of Public Health.
