EXECUTIVE ORDER

Appointment of District Attorney for the Seventh Judicial District.

On Tuesday, January 4, 2011, Myrl Serra resigned as the District Attorney for the Seventh Judicial District effective at 12:01 p.m. on Tuesday, January 11, 2011. Governor Ritter issued Executive Order D 2011-01 reinstating Executive Order D 2010-018, which, pursuant to C.R.S. § 24-31-101(1)(a), required the Attorney General to appear for the State and prosecute all criminal actions and proceedings in which the State is a party in the Seventh Judicial District. Pursuant to the authority vested in the Office of the Governor of the State of Colorado, in particular section 20(4) of article VI of the Colorado Constitution and section 1-12-204 of the Colorado Revised Statutes, I, John W. Hickenlooper, Governor of the State of Colorado, hereby issue this Executive Order appointing Dan W. Hotsenpiller District Attorney for the Seventh Judicial District, effective January 25, 2011.

ORDERED:

That, pursuant to section 20(4) of article VI of the Colorado Constitution and section 1-12-204 of the Colorado Revised Statutes, Dan W. Hotsenpiller of Montrose, Colorado, be and is hereby appointed District Attorney for the Seventh Judicial District. This appointment shall be effective January 25, 2011 and shall continue until a new District Attorney is elected for the Seventh Judicial District in the 2012 general election and takes the oath of office on January 8, 2013. Executive Order D 2011-01 and Executive Order D 2010-018, which served to appoint the Attorney General to prosecute criminal matters in the Seventh Judicial District, are both rescinded effective January 25, 2011.

Executive Order D 2010-17, appointing the Attorney General for the State of Colorado as the State's prosecutor to investigate and, if appropriate, prosecute criminal matters related to possible criminal conduct by Myrl Serra, remains in full force and effect as originally promulgated.
