I wish to serve on the Colorado Water Conservation Board because I believe that the coming years will be a critical time in Colorado's water future as we engage in important water planning processes, water projects, and water management challenges. I wish to lend my skills, training, time, and energy to helping address these challenges to find solutions that work for communities, agriculture, wildlife, tourism, and our rivers. I hope that my practical experience in water law, project management, and water infrastructure development, combined with a unique perspective gained serving as water counsel to one of the two federally-recognized Indian Tribes in Colorado, will allow me to represent a wide range of water users and stakeholders from Southwestern Colorado on the CWCB Board.

Implementation of Colorado's Water Plan

As a long-term member of the Southwest Basin Roundtable (serving on both Tribal and at-large seats), I have a strong appreciation for the CWCB's leadership and vision in the development of Colorado's Water Plan and the Southwest Basin Roundtable's Basin Implementation Plan. I am excited about the opportunity to participate in the implementation of Colorado's Water Plan, especially as the CWCB funds important water development projects and planning processes like stream management plans across the State.

Balancing Competing Water Uses and Future Water Supply Needs

During my time representing Tribal water interests throughout several basins in Southwestern Colorado, engaging in federal water project management, and participating in Colorado River Basin studies and modeling efforts, I gained a deep understanding and respect for the difficulty of balancing competing water uses on rivers hit hard by demand and supply imbalances and drought. I anticipate that the CWCB's work to balance the needs of consumptive and non-consumptive water uses in the State will become more difficult, and more important, as we begin to approach or bump up on limits for our available water supply.

However, I strongly believe (and hope) that these demand and supply imbalances and events approaching water supply limits will provide the State with significant opportunities to look at innovative water management and collaborative solutions that will help us all meet the needs of farmers and ranchers, cities, and tourist economies, while also ensuring that water is available in our rivers for fish and wildlife and other non-consumptive uses and that we are meeting our compact obligations to other states. I look forward to an opportunity to help shape the CWCB's continued, excellent technical work and to encourage partnerships—from small, localized projects to large projects that span entire river basins—that will help conserve and protect our water supplies and our water uses into the future.

Stream & Lake Protection

I am particularly excited about the opportunity to work with the CWCB on its instream flow and natural lake level protection program. Through my work as a water attorney in southwestern Colorado and now as a project manager for The Nature Conservancy, I understand the challenges and the complexity of the decisions that the CWCB Board must make to establish, protect, and acquire protections for instream flows and natural lake levels. I believe that my

legal training and my ability to engage with a wide range of water users and stakeholders on instream flow and natural lake level proposals will be an asset to the CWCB board.

Finally, and on a more personal note, I wish to serve on the CWCB board because I have a huge personal and social stake in supporting and shaping the water future of our State. Living on the cusp of the San Juan Mountains and the Colorado Plateau, water touches every part of my life—from the snow I ski each winter that melts into the high elevation creeks I kayak in each spring, to the food I raise in my high-elevation garden, to my friends and neighbors who still must haul water to their cisterns to raise their families, and to the local cattle operations that my family helps to support. I want to use my skills and training to protect our way of life here in southwestern Colorado and across the State.
