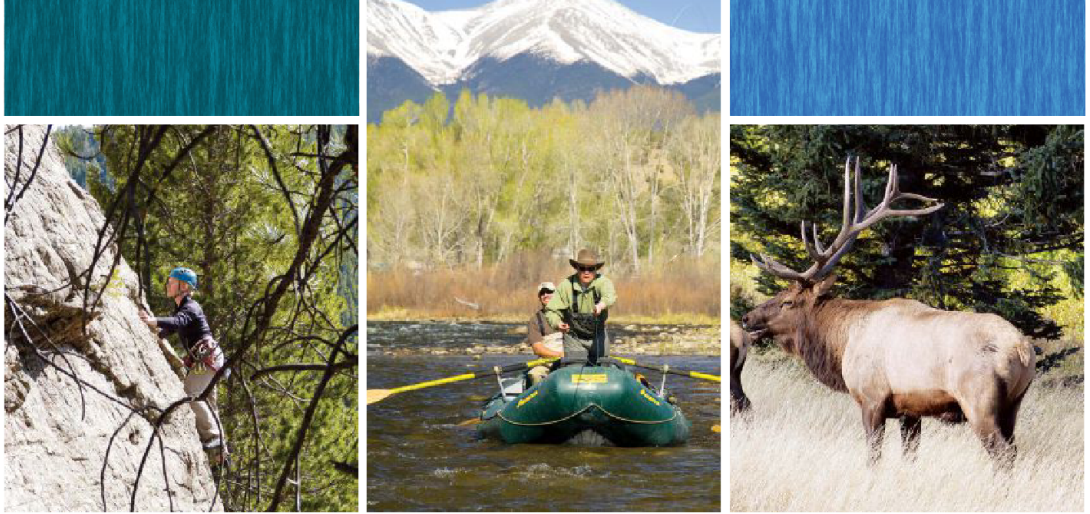

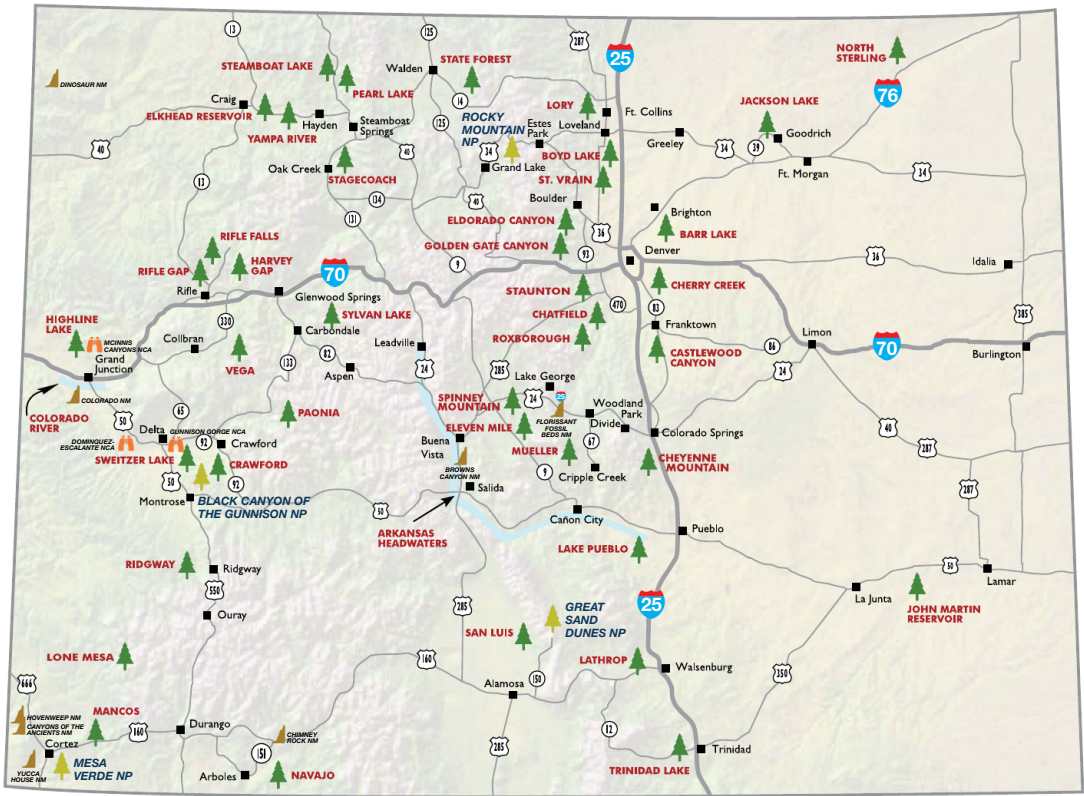

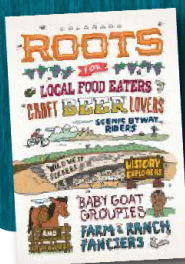

4 INSPIRING WAYS TO HORSE AROUND IN COLORADO

Blessed with a bounty of wide-open spaces and weaned on our forefathers' don't-fence-me-in attitude, Colorado has long been a haven for horse lovers. And, whether you're an accomplished equestrian or a weekend wrangler, there's no denying this fact: even Colorado's most celebrated vistas look just a little bit better with a horse in the frame (see above). These four unforgettable ways to kick up your heels are just the start.

MOVE 'EM OUT!

Advanced riders can get a truly next-level equine experience with the Great American Horse Drive, which typically takes place late April to early May. A Colorado tradition for more than four decades, the drive gives participants the once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to move a herd from Sombrero Stables in Craig across 60 miles of breathtaking open range.

1 BUCK UP Even if you've never set foot in a stirrup, you can still experience Colorado's thriving cowboy culture from a safe spot in the bleachers — at one of our many small-town rodeos. The award-winning **Elizabeth Stampede Rodeo** (June 6–8, 2015) is a favorite of locals and visitors alike; despite a potentially distracting view of the Rockies to the west, all eyes will be on the thrilling action in the arena. Pueblo's **Wild West Festival** (May 15–17, 2015) blends big-name events like Professional Bull Riders buck-offs with down-home offerings like a kids' carnival and chili cook-off. Find more ideas at COLORADO.com/Rodeos.

2 HORSE SENSE Don't let our rugged exterior fool you — Colorado is a great place to be a greenhorn, and a scenic trail ride is a wonderful way to learn some basic horsemanship. **Bach'lers Stable** near Ouray takes leisurely all-levels rides across Gold Hill, as well as pack trips along the Dallas Trail and San Juan Hut system. Pagosa Springs' **Diamond Hitch Stables** offers everything from kids' pony rides to cowboy cookouts to cattle drives. And for multi-sport types, there's the **Rusty Spurr Ranch** in Kremmling; their all-day Saddle & Paddle adventure pairs a trail ride with whitewater rafting. Find plenty more at COLORADO.com/RidingStables.

3 CORRAL KINDNESS Colorado is home to dozens of equine rescue centers and sanctuaries, and virtually all of them welcome volunteers. Springfield's **Blue Rose Ranch** rescues and rehabilitates unwanted horses and neglected pets — and helps to find them forever homes. **Ruby Ranch Horse Rescue** in Ramah handles dire neglect cases as well as horses relinquished by owners; animals considered unadoptable are given a loving, permanent home at the ranch. And at **Edwards Foundation** in Parker, horses with heart-wrenching pasts find love and room to roam. Call in advance to match your skill set with a center's needs.

4 CREATIVE CANTER Horses are inspiring creatures, and you don't have to be astride a saddle to feel the spark of creativity. At the third annual **Painting Horses Retreat** with acclaimed artist Jill Soukup, held Sept. 20–25, 2015, at Zapata Ranch in Mosca, curriculum includes equine anatomy, composition and sketching. Crafty types can learn from saddle maker Jesse Smith, in Pritchett. His intensive five-week **Saddle School** delivers detailed one-on-one instruction — and sends students home with one heck of a souvenir. Also catch **Deborah Butterfield: The Nature of Horses**, a life-size horse sculpture exhibit at the Denver Botanic Gardens May 23–Oct. 18, 2015.

ANCIENT ROOTS

8 Native American Sites to Explore

We can't very well discuss Colorado's true roots without remembering our earliest inhabitants. The following sites and museums will have your imagination floating back in time to the first and most fascinating human experiences in Colorado.

1 MESA VERDE NATIONAL PARK, NEAR DURANGO AND CORTEZ

Inside this national treasure are over 600 dwellings carved out of rock thousands of years ago by the area's Ancestral Puebloans. They sit abandoned by their creators beneath protective cliffs. Come see the Southwestern landscape through new eyes: climb ancient staircases, marvel at the sandstone masonry and peer through rock-carved windows into the past.

2 UTE INDIAN MUSEUM, MONTROSE

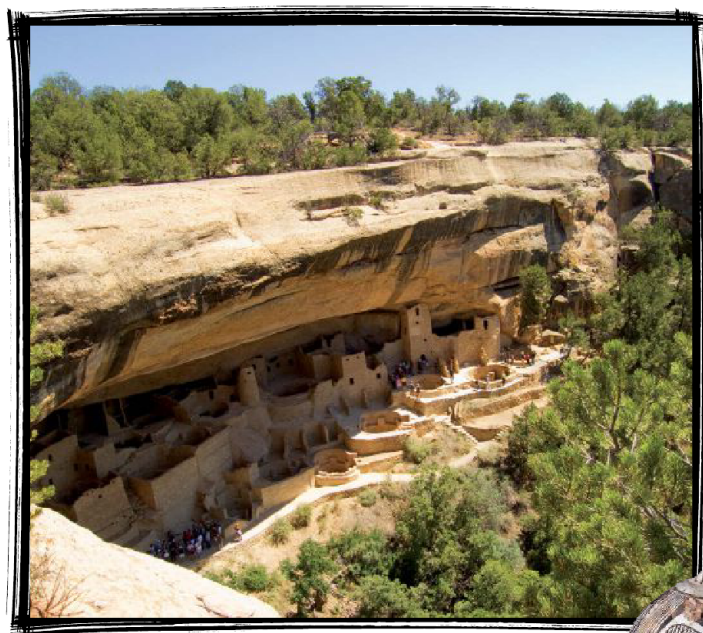
The lives and ways of the Utes — the indigenous inhabitants of western Colorado — are commemorated in this museum, one of the few in the country devoted to a single tribe. Be sure to watch the video on the traditional bear dance, visit the memorial to Chief Ouray and see the grave of his wife Chipeta. Surrounding walking trails provide a peaceful place to reflect after your visit.

3 UTE COUNCIL TREE, DELTA

When is a tree not just a tree? When it's a 200-year-old cottonwood where Chief Ouray, his wife Chipeta and Ouray's braves met with white settlers to smoke the pipe of peace and settle their differences. Chipeta was said to have been the only American Indian woman ever permitted to sit in council meetings. The tree was designated a Colorado Landmark and is marked by a plaque provided by the local chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution.

4 CANYONS OF THE ANCIENTS NATIONAL MONUMENT, DOLORES

There are more than 6,000 documented archaeological sites in this "outdoor museum," but most are not marked or obvious to the untrained eye. Read: Fewer crowds, but a find-it-yourself approach. A great starting point is the Anasazi Heritage Center, which provides information on exploring the monument, as well as exhibits on archaeology and local history, two 12th-century archaeological sites and a nature trail.



TIME TRAVEL BY CAR

Driving the Trail of the Ancients Scenic and Historic Byway, one of 25 Colorado byways, is an excellent way to visit several of the sites listed here — plus a few more — in one fell swoop. trailoftheancients.com

5 HOVENWEEP NATIONAL MONUMENT

Near Canyons of the Ancients, Hovenweep's six prehistoric, Puebloan-era villages are spread over a 20-mile expanse of mesa tops and canyons. Explore the Square Tower Group to get a first glimpse of the Puebloans' expert masonry. Still-standing circular towers, walls with pictographs, kivas (ceremonial underground rooms), stone dams and more can be found along several short hiking trails.

6 SOUTHERN UTE CULTURAL CENTER & MUSEUM, IGNACIO

This impressive facility celebrates the living history of Colorado's longest continuous residents in an architecturally inspired, highly modern setting. A permanent gallery, multi-sensory exhibitions, rare artifact collections and recorded stories make it an immersive, interactive experience.

7 PLAINS CONSERVATION CENTER, AURORA

See how two contrasting cultures converged on the Colorado prairie by examining the re-created teepee camps of the nomadic Cheyenne tribe and visiting Wells Crossing, a 1887 pioneer outpost with two homesteads, a school house, a blacksmith shop, an heirloom garden and a chicken coop.

8 SAND CREEK MASSACRE SITE, EADS

A visit to this site (the only Civil War site in Colorado) uncovers the seldom-told story of a unprovoked attack on a group of Cheyenne and Arapaho people. In 1864, a group of 675 U.S. volunteer cavalry slaughtered over 160 Plains Indians who were camped under the protection of the American flag. Learn about how the horrific incident forever changed the course of history for the Plains Indians and the country.



A POWWOW REVIVED

A small but devoted group of participants gathers in September each year for the **Annual Saguache Community Powwow**, an intertribal celebration that has successfully revived a powwow tradition dating back more than two decades. Come enjoy dancing, music, food and festivities in this small town located at the north edge of the beautiful San Luis Valley.

COLORADO: THE STATE OF CRAFT BEER

Craft breweries are not new to Colorado. Boulder Beer opened its doors 36 years ago as the state's first micro-brewery and is still brewing today. Since then, the craft brewing community has quickly woven its way into the culture that helps make Colorado so unique.

Today, Colorado has over 260 craft breweries making world-class beers that are attracting beer lovers from around the globe. Colorado craft brewers offer a large diversity of beer styles for you to choose from. Pilsners, IPAs, stouts, ambers, porters, cask, Belgian, saisons and sour ales are all carefully crafted to the highest of standards.

No matter what time of year, special events are always being created to showcase the local brewers. Just about any weekend during the year, you can find a beer festival where you can sample beer from dozens of brewers in the very same location. The largest of all is the Great American Beer Festival, where over 600 American craft brewers gather in Denver for one of the world's largest beer events.

Breweries are spread out all over Colorado, with nearly every city or town having its own brewery. Also, most every brewery is open to the public and has the ability to serve its beers to anyone over 21 years of age in the very same building where it was brewed. Every brewery has its own character and approach to the beers they brew and how they brew them; it's very safe to say there are no two breweries alike.

So as you travel throughout Colorado, enjoy the breathtaking scenery, local foods, abundant wildlife, flourishing farms — and then wash it all down with a Colorado-crafted beer.

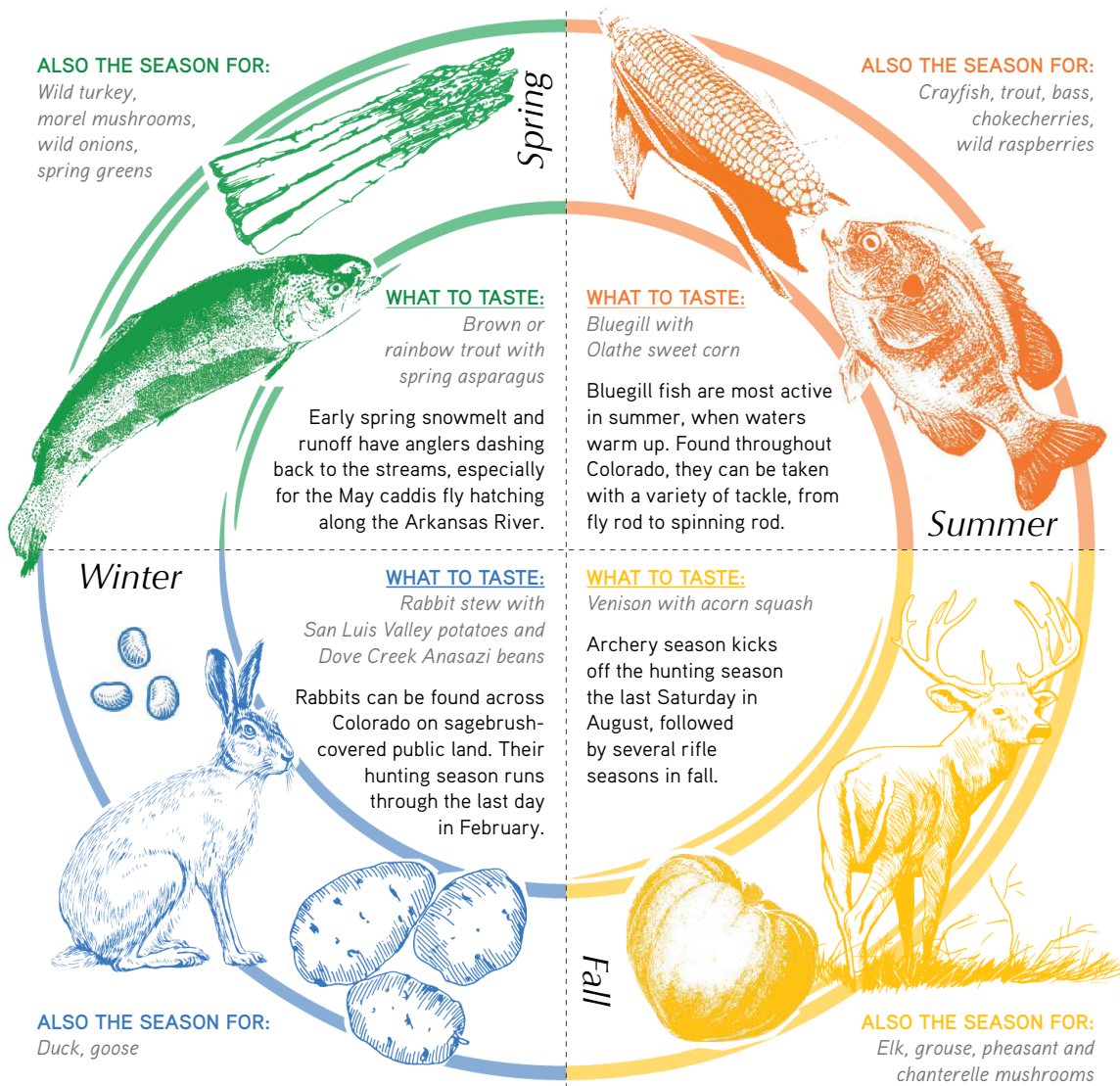

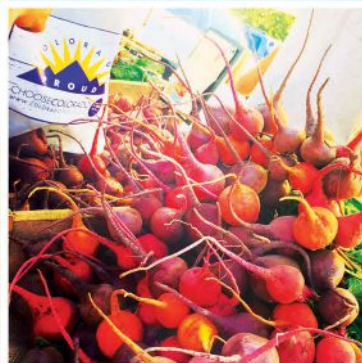
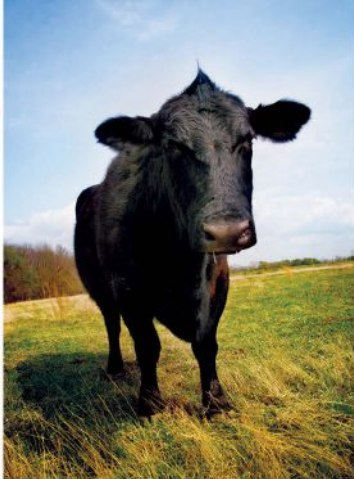

The array of products grown, raised and produced in Colorado is staggering. Farmers grow a variety of crops including beets, millet, cauliflower and lavender. Ranchers also have diversified to raise fish, yaks and alpacas. These are a few of the unique products produced in addition to many traditional ones like corn, wheat, beef and lamb.

During the summer months, you can find Colorado's freshest fruits, vegetables and other products at farmers' markets, roadside stands and U-picks. With more than 100 farmers' markets located across the state, everyone is sure to find what their taste buds are seeking.

After a long hike in the mountains, take a break with a cool beverage to quench your thirst. Whether it's a cold glass of milk or a frosty mug of beer, Colorado produces both in abundance. As you are traveling, you may want to visit one of Colorado's wineries. Dig in and get your hands dirty as this small, certified-organic family farm teaches you all the ins and outs of growing your own lavender. 2 FIBER ARTS CLASSES, TABLE ROCK LLAMAS FIBER ARTS STUDIO
BLACK FOREST

3 GOAT HUSBANDRY, MOUNTAIN GOAT LODGE
SALIDA

This bed and breakfast is run by Gina and D'Arcy Marcell, passionate, bleating-heart goat farmers who have spent years rescuing and raising goats. AND OTHER TIPS FOR VISITING COLORADO FARMS AND RANCHES

Farm and ranch hosts across Colorado tend to be a warm and welcoming lot and will happily guide you through the dos and don'ts of visiting their particular property. But there are a few general guidelines we recommend to keep you and those around you (including the furry farm residents) safe and happy during your visit. Use your good common sense and follow these easy rules of etiquette when hitting the range for U-picks, tours and events.



BRING THE KIDDOS

There's so much for kids to see and do on a farm, and their natural curiosity comes to life in rural environments. It's important, however, to make sure kids are never unattended. Safety comes first on a working farm or ranch, with animals you don't want spooked and equipment that might not be best for little hands to touch.

FRIEND A FARMER

Feel free to introduce yourself, ask questions and be curious. Farmers and ranchers have stories to tell —

CONNECT WITH ANIMALS

Farm animals are fascinating, whether at a distance or up close. Just be sure to ask before you pet. Herd animals can scare easily and, while adorable and frisky, the farm dog might actually need to stay focused on his farm work. Animals are often on a feeding schedule and shouldn't be fed unless your host invites you to. And it's best to leave your own furry friends at home. Too-friendly dogs can distress the animals that live on a farm and ranch.

and many properties have been in the same family for generations. Find out how life has changed for them over the years, why they do what they do, and the impact their work has on your own life and the heritage of the area. Keep in mind that many of them (and their staff) live on site and are opening up their homes and businesses to visitors. Be sure to act accordingly.

PLAN AHEAD

If hours aren't posted, call ahead to make sure your destination is ready for visitors. At certain times of year, farming can be all consuming, and while many farms have regular hours, smaller operations may find times when there's too much to be done to host groups in the field.

LEAVE YOUR SUNDAY BEST BEHIND

Embrace your inner cowpoke and wear clothes you don't mind getting dirty. For comfort and practicality, consider closed-toed shoes or boots, a hat, sunglasses and pants (for walking through brush or riding horses).

BE PREPARED

Bring cash to U-pick or farm stands; baskets or containers if you're picking produce; a cooler to get your goodies home; a camera to record your adventure; and sunscreen, bug spray and bottled water to stay comfortable.



LOOK, LISTEN AND LEARN

One of the best parts of visiting a farm or ranch is all the knowledge you'll bring home about a unique way of life and its traditions. To soak up as much as possible, be sure to heed the advice of your hosts if they ask you to remain seated in wagons or stay off certain fields or trails. Read and follow all signage, and never sample the produce without paying, unless you are invited to.

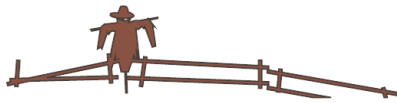

Since opening in 1997, Buena Vista’s **Jumpin’ Good Goat Dairy** (jumpinggoodgoats.com) has steadily become one of the premier goat cheese manufacturers in the country. Senior ambassador **M&M the goat** is happy to introduce you to the herd; swing by for an hour-long tour anytime between March and October. Whether you choose a morning Farm Tour or an afternoon Milking Tour, you’ll get to explore the cheese-making facilities and aging caves before heading to the Country Store for a cheese tasting.

Proprietor Andrea Martin is proud to run the state's smallest licensed dairy at **Broken Shovels Farm** ([facebook.com/brokenshovels](https://www.facebook.com/brokenshovels)) in Commerce City. Fewer than 40 pampered goats and a handful of other happy critters share her compact urban-sylvan space. Though spring's the best time to butt heads with the new kids, summer visitors won't want to miss the weekly Sunday markets: the perfect opportunity to sample Martin's amazing artisan cheeses and make friends with the farm's **charismatic roosters, Claude and Puffy**.

Although Moffat's **Chokurai Ranch** ([chokureiranch.com](https://www.chokureiranch.com)) also produces farm-fresh eggs and organic produce, it's their herd of Tibetan yak that truly sets them apart. In a tranquil valley flanked by the majestic Sangre de Cristo and San Juan mountains, **Growler the yak** and more than 200 of his fuzzy friends enjoy 2,400 acres of sprawling, ultra-sustainable rangeland. Stop by the Farm Store's juice bar before your safari-style yak tour, then savor a hearty lunch at the Yak N Cracker Café — featuring a variety of only-in-Colorado dishes like Veggie Rainbow Pot Pie and Yak Quesadillas.

Wishing Star Farm ([wishingstarfarm.com](https://www.wishingstarfarm.com)), located in rural Calhan, is the ultimate family foray. Kids 5-8 can attend day camps during the month of June, and the farm is open year-round for private tours. Little ones will love meeting **Boo the camel** and his brethren, which include goats, sheep, pigs, ponies, donkeys and bunnies; parents can linger in the Harvest Store, sampling locally made jams and jellies, root beer and fresh-baked goodies. But the best time to visit is during the farm's popular Fall Festival, when Wishing Star comes alive with a pick-your-own pumpkin patch, hay rides, duck races and more.

Native to the highlands of Peru, Bolivia and Chile, alpaca are known for their sweet temperament and fine, dense fleece — and, thanks to climatic and geographic similarities between the Andes and the Rockies, these gentle animals thrive here in Colorado, too. Loma's **Horse Mountain Alpacas** ([horsemountainalpacas.com](https://www.horsemountainalpacas.com)) offers hands-on visits with **matriarch alpaca Ruby** and the 40+ members of her herd; babies are typically born between April and September, so spring and summer visitors will have a good chance of cuddling a cria. Fiber is harvested in May, then used to create ultra-soft yarns, hats, scarves, gloves, rugs and more.

Born in 1896 as a modest apple orchard with a roadside stand, Longmont's **YA YA Farm & Orchard** ([yayafarmandorchard.com](https://www.yayafarmandorchard.com)) also boasts 860 trees producing more than 125 varieties. Though the farm's fieldwork has traditionally been done by teams of Percheron horses, today **Black Six** and his buddies have additional responsibilities: greeting visitors, accepting neck-rubs and eating LOTS of fallen fruit. Reservations for fall u-pick-it sessions start in January — set aside at least an hour to meet the horses, fill your bags and enjoy fresh-pressed cider with warm donuts.

Before visiting or touring any farm, we recommend you call ahead to make sure your hosts will be available. See more tips for visiting farms on page 14.

TIPS FOR PICKING



| PRODUCE | WHAT TO LOOK FOR | SEASON |
|---------------------|--|--|
| APPLES | Choose apples that are firm to the touch, without bruises, with good color and a pleasant smell. | <i>Aug.-Nov. Most are harvested in Sept.</i> |
| CANTALOUPE | Ripe cantaloupe will have a distinctive aroma and the blossom end should yield to gentle pressure. Cantaloupes that were kept on the vine until fully ripe will have a clean depression where the stem was attached. Avoid cantaloupes that are shriveled, bruised or that have punctured or cracked rinds. | <i>Aug.-mid-Oct.</i> |
| CARROTS | Carrots should be vibrant orange and well shaped with firm, smooth exteriors. Avoid soft or wilted carrots or those with growth cracks or splits. | <i>Aug.-Nov.</i> |
| CHERRIES | Look for cherries that are plump, with firm, smooth and brightly colored skins. Good quality cherries should have green stems attached. Avoid cherries with blemishes, rotted or mushy skins, or those that are shriveled and dull. | <i>Mid-June through mid-July.</i> |
| LEAF LETTUCE | Leaf lettuce should be crisp and well colored. Avoid leaf lettuce with yellow leaves or with leaves showing cracked ribs. | <i>June through Oct.</i> |
| ONIONS | Good-quality dry onions should be firm and hard with short, tight necks and dry, papery skins. A slightly loose outer skin is common and should not affect quality. Avoid onions that show mold, decay or blemishes. | <i>Aug.-March.</i> |
| PEACHES | Peaches should be picked when the background color (not the red side toward the sun, but the backside of the fruit) has changed from green to white or yellow. If the peaches are to be eaten quickly, the best possible peach is one that has already started to soften on the tree, however, if they are to be stored then they should still be firm, but with the light background color. | <i>Aug.-mid-Sept.</i> |
| POTATOES | All potato varieties should be uniformly sized, fairly clean, firm and smooth. Avoid potatoes with wrinkled skins, soft dark spots, cut surfaces or green appearance. Look for a variety of Colorado potatoes, including Yukon gold, russet, fingerling and purple. | <i>Year-round.</i> |
| SWEET CORN | Sweet corn should have fresh, green husks with silk ends that are free of decay or worms. Ears should be evenly covered with plump, consistently sized kernels. Avoid corn with discolored or dry-looking husks, stem ends or kernels. | <i>Mid-July through mid-Oct.</i> |
| TOMATOES | Tomatoes should have bright, shiny skins and firm flesh. Avoid tomatoes that are soft or mushy, lacking in color, or have blemishes or growth cracks. | <i>Mid-July-mid-Oct. (greenhouse tomatoes year-round).</i> |
| WATERMELON | Choose a symmetrical melon that is heavy for its size. | <i>Aug.-Sept.</i> |
