Enclosed please find a legislative report to the Senate Health and Human Services Committee from the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing on Home and Community Based Services (HCBS)waiver for Children with Autism (CWA).

Section 25.5-6-806(2)(a) requires the Department to submit a written program evaluation concerning the Home and Community Based Services- Children with Autism waiver by June 1st, 2013.

The program evaluation includes the number of eligible children who have received services under the waiver program, the average and median age of eligible children when they began receiving services, the average length of time that children receive services, and the average cost of services provided to an eligible child. The information is provided below and includes data from calendar year 2007 through calendar year 2012.
