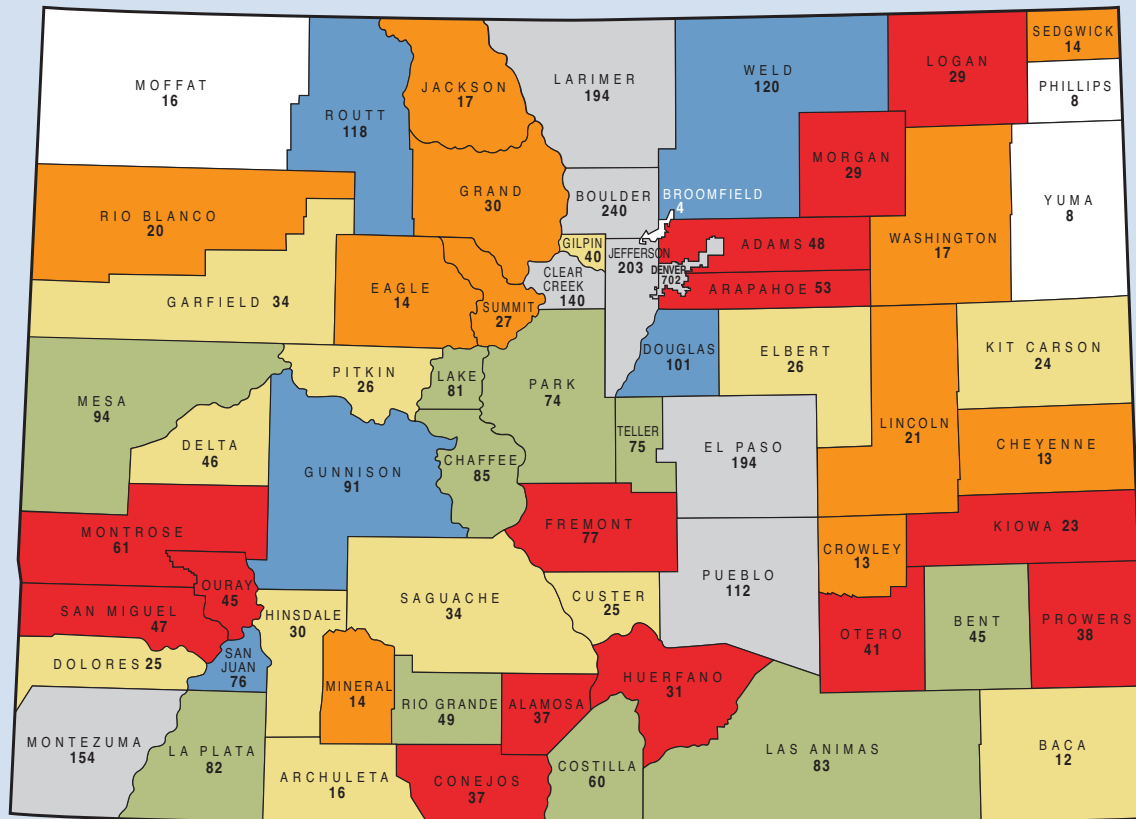

Total Grant Dollars Awarded by County Since Program's Inception

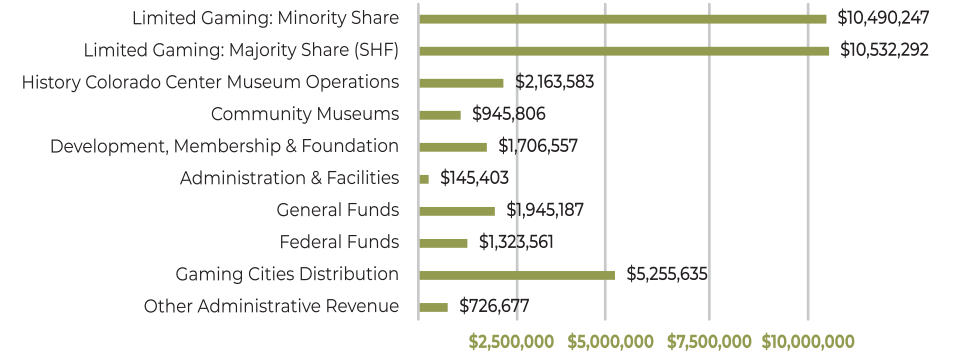


Number of grants awarded indicated by numbers on the map. Projects affecting multiple counties are not shown.



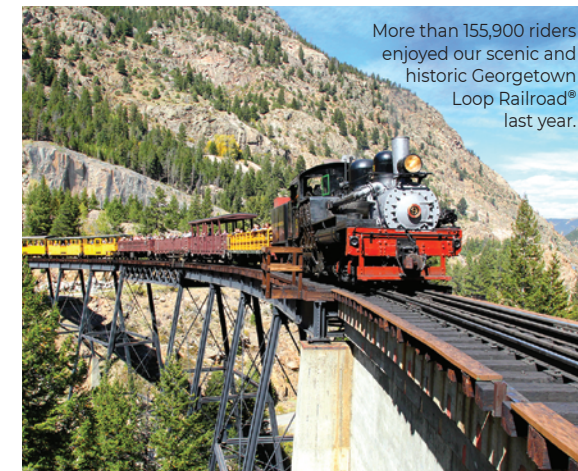
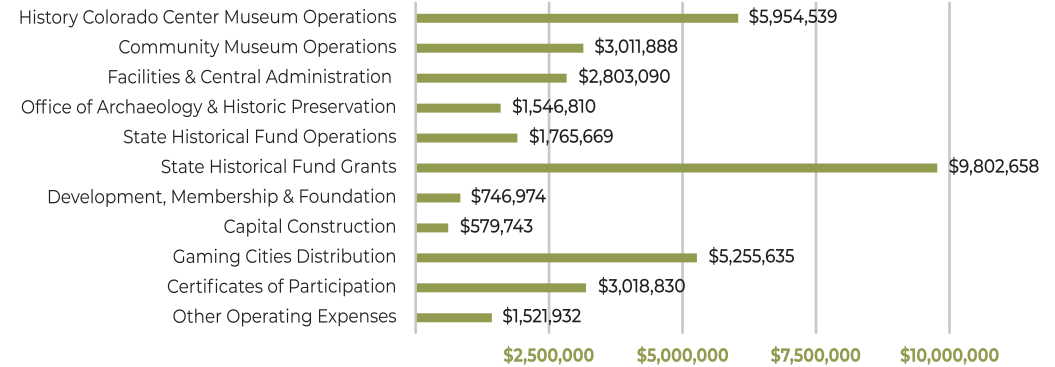
Financial Summary July 1, 2019–June 30, 2020

History in the Making

Inclusive, values-driven, and intentional, History Colorado responded to the COVID-19 pandemic with an agile reorganization during a months-long closure of its eight museums. To capture this historic moment we launched our **collecting initiative**, one of the nation's most comprehensive. Anyone can share their story (in English or Spanish), create and share a journal, leave a voicemail, submit photos and videos, or donate objects, all with an eye toward preserving for posterity the challenges and hopes of our time. The **Colorado Media Project**, a collaborative of 40 news outlets, is boosting the effort around the state; in exchange, journalists have access to the resources we collect.

Prior to the pandemic, our **Bold Women. Change History.** initiative brought renowned speakers to the History Colorado Center, a Smithsonian affiliate in the heart of Denver. In tandem, and as the pandemic set in, a corps of volunteers—from the safety of their homes—**transcribed 550 suffrage-related documents** in our collection. The effort has created new resources for the public to access in discovering Colorado's role in the suffrage movement.

We released new episodes of our award-winning podcast **Lost Highways: Dispatches from the Shadows of the Rocky Mountains**, including a timely bonus episode on the 1918 flu epidemic. In addition to this flagship podcast, **COauthored** features oral histories including a Greeley man's recollections from 1918, and **UnPacked** shares recordings of our nationally recognized lecture speakers such as those who headlined our **Borderlands of Southern Colorado** series.

With so many people isolated at home, we launched a **weekly digest** to share insightful resources from us and our friends, all with a dose of cheer. It's welcomed into more than 26,000 inboxes.

Empowering Through Education

We transformed lectures and programs into digital experiences that people enjoyed safely from home—in the process reaching new audiences across the country.

We transformed our **Beyond Storytime** program from El Pueblo History Museum into a digital experience for preschool-age kids at home. English- and Spanish-language storytimes included stories, songs, and conversation.

Hands-On History is our popular education program designed to meet the needs of working families when kids aren't in school. We quickly moved this program to the digital realm—offering daily workshops for kids learning from home. Our **Hands-On History** at Morey Middle School, **Bridging Borders for Young Men of Color** at South Middle School in Aurora, and **Antonito Youth Memory Project** at Antonito High School all moved to a digital learning space as well, enabling teens to keep connected and supported.

Meeting Needs Across Colorado

While working from home, our **State Historical Fund** staff distributed more than \$1 million in grant funding to community projects across the state in an expedited spring grant round. These investments in Colorado's communities were a welcome boost to local

economies at a time of great economic challenge due to the pandemic. A new series of **archaeology and preservation webinars** grew in recognition and impact, quickly reaching hundreds of viewers with every session.

We've found other ways to do our part as well. Our El Pueblo History Museum collected donated supplies for community elders in collaboration with local organizations; our Fort Garland Museum became a **Community Access Site** for San Luis Valley college students in need of digital connection to online classes; and our curatorial and archaeology teams donated masks and gloves for the medical effort. And, we've rolled out a new **History Buffs** program, enabling every fourth grader in Colorado to claim a free membership along with the myriad benefits that bring both education and fun—including a ticket to ride the scenic and historic Georgetown Loop Railroad.

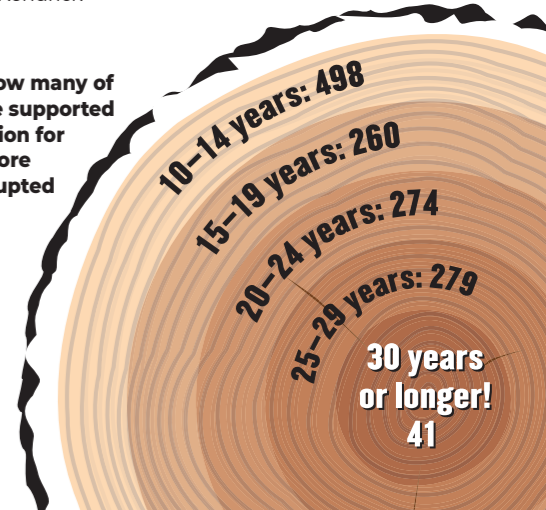
