

### System Summary – Academic Year 2010 Degrees Awarded

In the academic year 2009-2010, 12,301 certificates and degrees were awarded at Colorado Community College System schools. This is nearly an 11% increase from AY 2009. The largest group of awards were 1-year certificates, at 44.1%, followed by AA / AS degrees at 19.1%. Generally, AGS and AA / AS degrees are transfer-oriented awards, while AAS degrees are considered terminal awards.



Over the past four years, there has been a 27% increase in awards granted at CCCS colleges. The most significant increase has been in 1-year certificates with many people returning to college for retraining. Overall, 40% more certificates were awarded in AY 2010 than in 2007.

The most common awards by program level were all within the healthcare field. EMT was the most awarded 1-year certificate, LPN was the top 2-yearr certificate, and RN the top AAS degree given. Due to programs imposing enrollment limitations based on clinical site availability and the Community College of Denver not admitting any new students, there has been an overall decrease in the number of nursing degrees awarded resulting in a slight decrease in AAS degrees overall.

Of all degrees awarded at any level (excluding liberal arts and general studies), the top program areas were Emergency Medical Services, Nursing Aide, Nursing, Early Childhood Education, Criminal Justice and Automotive Technology. Programs may be approved to be offered at different levels at different colleges, i.e. EMS.

Of all degrees awarded (excluding liberal arts and general studies), 53% were in the healthcare field, compared to 54% in 2009. 56% of certificates were in the health science area, and 44% of AAS degrees.

### **College Summary**

Front Range Community College awarded the greatest number of awards (23%), consistent with their larger enrollment. They were followed by Pikes Peak Community College (14%). Three other colleges each awarded 11% of the overall degree total.
