System Highlights

- CCCS colleges awarded 15,729 **degrees** in AY 2012-2013, an increase of 10.5 percent over the AY 2011-12 level of 14,235.
- The number of **transfers** to four-year colleges increased 7.8 percent, from 11,150 to 12,024.
- ➤ **High school students** attending CCCS colleges increased 17.0 percent, from 14,348 to 16,780. Over the last five years, the number of high school students increased 125.8 percent.
- > The systemwide **remedial course completion** rate increased 2.9 percent, from 67.6 percent to 69.5 percent. Course completion rates increased in all subjects (English, math, and reading).
- > The Fall to Fall **retention** rate increased from 46.9 percent to 47.1 percent.
- The proportion of **minority students** increased from 33.8 percent to 34.4 percent in AY 2012-13.





Academic Year 2012-2013 Headcount by Residency - Percentage





Academic Year 2012-2013 FTE by Residency - Percentage







Academic Year 2012-2013 Headcount by Percentage FT/PT Status





Academic Year 2012-2013 Headcount by Ethnicity - Percentage







Academic Year 2012-2013 Headcount by Age Group - Percentage







Academic Year 2012-2013 Headcount by Gender - Percentage








Academic Year 2012-2013 Percentage Distribution of Headcount by Type of Degree Sought*




