ACADEMIC YEAR 2009-2010 REMEDIAL ENROLLMENT AND COURSE COMPLETION RATES

OCTOBER 2010



Remedial Course Enrollment

In the academic year 2009-2010, there were over 68,000 enrollments in remedial courses throughout the community college system. Remedial course offerings include courses in Reading, English, and Math below the 100 level, with 11 total courses available in 2009-2010. Of the total enrollment, more than 60% were in one of the five math courses offered (Table 1), though English 090 was the course taken most frequently, accounting for 18.0% of enrollments. Community College of Denver had the largest percentage of remedial course enrollments, with 24.3% of the entire remedial population (Table 2.)

Over the past four academic years, remedial course enrollments have increased by nearly 65%, with math being the fastest growing subject (Table 3.) A significant portion of this increase is due to the introduction of MAT 099, which was previously a college level course (MAT 106). Without these enrollments, however, there has still been a 43% increase in remedial enrollment from 2006 to 2010. MAT 075, which is a combined section of MAT 030 and 060 (for TSJC) or 060 and 090 (for FRCC and RRCC) has also been introduced, and will potentially impact enrollment in future years.

Remedial enrollments now make up 12% of all enrollments, up from 9.6% in academic year 2006-2007 (Table 4.) Overall course enrollments increased 31% during this time period.

Of the 68,067 remedial course enrollments, there were 35,948 individual students enrolled in one or more remedial courses over the academic year (Table 5.) This equates to 26.7% of the overall headcount for academic year 2009-2010. Nearly half of these students enrolled in only one remedial course, but 9.5% of remedial students were enrolled in four or more remedial courses during the academic year.

From academic year 2006-2007 to academic year 2009-2010, headcount has increased by 25.5%, while the number of students taking a remedial course has increased 76.7%. Overall, 26.7% of students are now enrolled in at least one remedial course (Table 6.)

Course Completion Rates

Of all remedial course enrollments, 61.1% ended in successful end of term completion (Table 7.) Course completion is defined as receiving an A, B, C or Satisfactory at end of term. Courses held in the summer term had higher completion rates at 66.8% than those enrolled in fall and spring semester with 61.5% and 59.2%, respectively. Overall, Reading courses had the highest completion rates (65.7%, compared to 63.6% for English and 59.1% for Math.)


Course completion rates have slightly decreased for all subjects (Table 8) since Academic Year 2006-2007.

For unsuccessful course completions, it appears that students are withdrawing at a comparable rate across courses and subjects with the exception of MAT 075 and 099 (Table 10.) As seen nationally, math courses in general have the lowest pass rates. These lower passing rates can be attributed to greater rates of failures, withdrawals and incompletes, all of which are higher than those for English and Reading.

In general, rural colleges have higher overall course completion rates, particularly in English courses (Table 11.)

Remedial Student Success

In academic year 2009-2010, 25,014 individual students successfully completed at least one course, or 70% of students enrolled in remedial courses (Table 13.)




A greater percentage of the students at urban institutions are enrolled in remedial courses than at rural (Figure 2.) A greater percentage of students at rural institutions successfully complete their remedial coursework.

Successful vs. Unsuccessful Completion






By and large, students enrolled in remedial courses are closely reflective of the overall population based on gender (Figure 3.) However, a greater percentage of female students than male students successfully complete their remedial coursework. System-wide, the course completion rate for females is 65%, compared to 56% for males (Table 15.)

Successful vs. Unsuccessful Completion





Consistent with national data, greater percentages of minority students are enrolled in remedial courses than white students (Figure 4.) Over 40% of the students enrolled in remedial courses are minorities (Table 16.) In addition, non-minority students complete their remedial courses at a higher rate than minority students (Table 17). Minority students had a course completion rate of 57.4% for all remedial courses, compared to 63.7% for all other students (including those with no ethnicity reported). This is true system-wide, with the exception of Colorado Northwestern Community College and Lamar Community College, who have higher rates of completion in their minority population.

Successful vs. Unsuccessful Completion





Recent high school graduates are more likely to be enrolled in remedial courses than those from older age categories (Figure 5) though this can vary widely by campus (Table 18.) As age increases, it is less likely that students will be enrolled in remedial courses, and students in the older age categories are more likely to successfully complete at least one remedial course. Students that are <18-20 have a course completion rate of 56.6%, compared to 64.1% for those over 21 (Table 19).

Successful vs. Unsuccessful Completion



Developmental coursework is offered both online and in a traditional method. Some colleges also offer hybrid or other special sections. System-wide, nearly 13% of remedial enrollments are in online courses (Table 20). Overall, the completion rate for courses utilizing a traditional instruction method is much greater than those offered online (62.1% vs. 53.3%). At some colleges, this difference is as much as 39% (Table 21). Red Rocks Community College is the only college where online students complete at a higher rate than traditional students.
