

DEVELOPMENTAL EDUCATION AND SUPPLEMENTAL ACADEMIC INSTRUCTION REPORT

ACADEMIC YEAR 2008-2009

Delopmental education (DE) courses are courses that are designed to bring students who have been identified as having academic deficiencies in reading, writing, and math up to grade level to participate in college level courses. This report details the rates of enrollment and associated descriptive statistics for students enrolled in developmental education courses in the Colorado Community College System for the 2008-2009 academic year, which covers the Summer 2008, Fall 2008, and Spring 2009 terms.

Readers of this report may be familiar with annual reports on remedial education published by the Colorado Department of Higher Education (CDHE) and the Colorado Commission on Higher Education (CCHE), which examine cohorts limited to new firsttime students ages 17-19 in remedial/developmental education in all Colorado public higher education
institutions ${ }^{1}$. This report has a broader scope, including all students enrolling in developmental education at CCCS during the academic year. This difference in methodology will allow the present report to more fully describe the state of developmental education in the Colorado Community College System; due to the different groups of students included, the information presented here cannot be directly compared to CDHE/CCHE remedial reports.

This report is divided into three sections. The first, "Enrollment in DE," shows enrollment counts for Developmental Education courses separated by college. Students in DE" examines the characteristics of students who enrolled in DE courses in the 2008-2009 academic year. The final section, "Academic Outcomes for Students in DE," contains summary information about key outcome indicators for students enrolled in DE courses during the 2008-2009 academic year.

## Enrollment in DE

Depending on whether withdrawn and incomplete enrollment records are counted, between 19.57\% and $21.09 \%$ of the 117,245 students included in the headcount reported by the 2008-2009 CCCS Fact Book enrolled in a DE course during this period. 24,764 unique students were recorded as having enrolled in at least one DE course in the Student Unit Record Data System (SURDS), with 22,654 unique students receivin a final grade (withdrawals and records with temporary grades such as " I " or "SP" are excluded from this number) Updated records in the CCCS Operational Data Store (ODS) show 24,729 unique students as having been enrolled in at least one DE course during this period, with 22,947 unique students receiving a final grade. While SURDS is considered the official record for many Colorado education statistics, the figures in this report
use the numbers obtained from the ODS in order to more accurately show the outcomes of course outcomes marked incomplete at the time of the initial report and to facilitat analyses that make use of variables present in the ODS but not in SURDS. A complete list of data sources can be found at the end of this report. The tables presented below summarize the patterns of enrollment in DE courses in the 2008-2009 academic year.

## Students in DE

The students enrolled in DE courses during this time 1 period were somewhat younger on average than 28 , the overall average age reported in the 2008-2009 CCCS Fact Book, with a mean age of 25 and a median age of 22 at the beginning of the Fall 2008 semester. Males and non-white minority groups were also represented to a greater extent in the DE population than in the
population as a whole. As many courses offered at CCCS colleges do not have prerequisite course requirements, many students taking DE courses during the 2008-2009 academic year were continuing students or re-admitted students. Table 6 describes the DE student population by academic period. Tables 4-7 summarize characteristics of the 2008-2009 Developmental Education student population.

## Academic Outcomes for Students in DE

this report, the success of students enrolled in developmental education courses has been measured using several outcome metrics, including: success in DE courses, completion of college-level courses following success in a related DE course, and completion of degrees and certificates. The tables on the following pages describe these outcomes

The DE course completion rates shown in the following tables use initial enrollments (as opposed to only course completions) as denominators. For this reason, passage rates shown in this report are slightly lower than those shown in the annual summary data printed in recent CCCS Fact Books ${ }^{3}$. While the reasons students withdraw from courses cannot be analyzed in the same way as final grades (a withdrawal cannot be directly related to discipline ability in the manner of a final grade), it is important to recognize the effect of this phenomenon.

In aggregate, the DE course success rate for the system in AY 2009 was $71 \%$ of initial enrollment, while $76.5 \%$ of those receiving final grades (as opposed to withdrawals or incompletes) had at least one passing grade of A, B, C, or "Satisfactory".

In the following tables, the passage rates for developmental courses, and data regarding subsequent college-level course completion are presented. In all cases, course completion is defined as receiving a grade of A, B, C, or "Satisfactory" in a course. The counts shown represent unique student counts, rather than individual enrollment records. As a student may take more than one developmental course in a term, summary counts will not be the sum of all counts within a category, but instead reflect the number of unique students taking courses within that category.

## DEGREES AND CERTIFICATES

t the time of this report, 4,583 students enrolled in - DE courses during the 2008-09 academic year had earned a degree or certificate through CCCS. Of these, 3,199 had earned at least one certificate, while 2,196 had
earned associate degrees. Table 15 shows the counts of DE students who earned certificates and degrees during the 2008-09 academic year and the three following years in greater detail.
