#### E. WATER QUALITY CERTIFICATIONS (Section 401)

Water Quality Certifications, under Section 401 of the Clean Water Act, provide for Division determinations that federally issued permits and licenses will comply with the Basic Standards and Methodologies for Surface Water, the Basic Standards for Ground Water, surface and ground water classifications and water quality standards, and all other applicable water quality requirements for the affected waters.

1. For the purposes of the antidegradation requirements found in Section 31.8 of the Basic Standards and Methodologies, the following projects have been reviewed to make a preliminary determination of the significance of such projects and a draft certification determination. Public comment on these preliminary determinations will be received for thirty days following the date of publication of this newsletter. 

## Water Quality Control Division Water Pollution Program Policies Proposed to be Formally Rescinded

The Water Pollution Control Program is evaluating all of its existing policies. This review as well as future periodic reviews of the Program's policies is a good business practice that helps ensure all of the policies are effectively supporting the implementation of current regulations. As part of the Program's *Policy Evaluation Project*, it is recommended that all outdated policies are formally rescinded. Specifically, the Water Pollution Control Program currently has a large number of policies that were implemented during the 1980s and 1990s. While regulations and practices have changed over the last three decades, many of these policies have not been re-evaluated since their inception.

It is proposed that the policies listed below be formally rescinded. These policies have either been superseded by newer policies or they are no longer relevant to the activities/practices of the Program. The table below further explains why it is recommended that each policy should be abolished.
