Water Quality Certifications, under Section 401 of the Clean Water Act, provide for Division determinations that federally issued permits and licenses will comply with the Basic Standards and Methodologies for Surface Water, the Basic Standards for Ground Water, surface and ground water classifications and water quality standards, and all other applicable water quality requirements for the affected waters.

1. Please note there was a mistake in the August bulletin regarding the proposed abolishment of WQP-19, PQL Policy—not WQP-19, Policy for Characterizing Ambient Water Quality for Use in Determining Water Quality Standards Based Effluent Limits. As noted in August bulletin, WQP-19, PQL Policy, is proposed to be formally rescinded because it has been incorporated into the Division's 2008 PQL Guidance. This fact remains true, however a link to the alternate WQP-19 policy was provided in the August bulletin.
