

# 2025 Drinking Water Revolving Fund Intended Use Plan





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## INTRODUCTION TO THE DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND

Colorado's Drinking Water Revolving Fund (DWRF) provides financial assistance to government agencies and private non-profit public water systems to construct water projects intended to improve public and environmental health, help compliance with the federal Safe Drinking Water Act, and invest in Colorado's water infrastructure.

State legislation (SB 95-083) established the Drinking Water Revolving Fund as an enduring and viable fund. The legislation states that the fund shall be maintained and available in perpetuity to provide financial assistance in accordance with the federal Safe Drinking Water Act.

## STATE REVOLVING FUND PARTNERSHIP

The State Revolving Fund (SRF) program is administered by three partner agencies. Colorado statute directs the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, Water Quality Control Division (division); the Colorado Water Resources and Power Development Authority (authority); and the Colorado Department of Local Affairs (DOLA), the division of local government to jointly operate the program. These agencies administer the SRF program with common goals approved and supported by the Water Quality Control Commission (WQCC) and the authority board of directors.

### Mission

- ❖ Provide low-cost, affordable financing to Colorado's drinking water systems to address the state's priority drinking water-related public health, water quality, and drinking water infrastructure needs.

- ❖ Actively target and allocate resources to projects and initiatives that result in significant public health and environmental benefits while building and maintaining a perpetual, self-sustaining revolving loan fund program.
- ❖ Manage the fund in a manner that provides benefits for current and future generations.

The agencies also partner with the Colorado Water Conservation Board, USDA Rural Development, Colorado Rural Water Association, the Rural Community Assistance Corporation, and other agencies as needed to collaborate on financing when appropriate.

### INTENDED USE PLAN (IUP)

The EPA capitalization grant agreement requires an Intended Use Plan (IUP). The IUP provides the framework to utilize funds, finance drinking water infrastructure, and support related program activities during the 2025 calendar year.

### SHORT-TERM GOALS

Short-term goals in 2025 include:

- Provide outreach, technical and financial assistance to public water systems that pose a risk to public health due to exceedances of drinking water health-based standards or other substandard infrastructure conditions. The SRF program focuses on systems that are in enforcement or under consideration for enforcement action, and those that exceed health-based standards for radionuclides.
- Address drinking water system health issues including lead, the federal unregulated contaminant monitoring rule, nitrates and other emerging issues such as perfluorinated compounds (PFCs).
- The division will market and encourage drinking water systems to participate in the Drinking Water Excellence program by offering grants and/or other incentives to systems that meet the various levels of the program.
- The agencies will review the effectiveness of the priority scoring model (Attachment I) and the use of additional subsidy.
- The agencies review the Disadvantaged Community criteria annually to ensure that the criteria include Colorado's disproportionately impacted communities (as defined by the general assembly).

### LONG-TERM GOALS

Colorado's long-term program goals include: public health protection, program sustainability and integrity, and providing support for the division's strategic plan goals.

Additional long-term goals include:

- Strengthen funding coordination efforts.
- Conduct training to build financial and managerial capacity of public water and wastewater systems across the state.
- Provide affordable financial assistance to eligible applicants while maintaining a perpetual revolving loan program. The program is sustained through re-loan funds, administrative fees, EPA annual appropriations (through capitalization grants to the state each year) and interest earnings.

### PROJECT ELIGIBILITY

Priority projects address risks to public health, disadvantaged communities, and compliance with the Safe Drinking Water Act. Examples of eligible and ineligible projects are listed below.\*

#### **ELIGIBLE PROJECT EXAMPLES**

Addresses present and future Safe Drinking Water Act requirements.

Replaces aging infrastructure.

Replacement of lead service line.

Restructure and consolidate water supplies to rectify contamination issues or to assist systems unable to maintain and ensure Safe Drinking Water Act compliance for financial or managerial reasons.

Purchase a portion of another system's capacity to cost effectively rectify a Safe Drinking Water Act compliance issue.

Acquisition of Water Rights for public health protection or resiliency/redundancy that applies to existing populations and not for growth.

Planning including required environmental assessment reports, design and construction costs associated with eligible projects.

Land acquisition.\*\*

Dams/rehabilitation of dams and reservoirs/rehabilitation of reservoirs owned by the public water system for drinking water supply. Project must support public health objectives of the Safe Drinking Water Act and cannot be for growth.

#### **INELIGIBLE PROJECT EXAMPLES**

Drinking water monitoring costs.

Operation and maintenance costs.

Projects primarily for fire protection.

Projects for systems that lack adequate technical, managerial and financial capability, unless assistance will ensure compliance.

Projects for systems in significant noncompliance under the Safe Drinking Water Act, unless funding will ensure compliance.

Projects primarily intended to serve future growth.

\*Water utilities distributing or supplying 2,000 acre-feet or more of water per year must have an approved and updated water conservation plan as defined by Section 37-60-126, CRS. The Colorado Water Conservation Board provides approval.

**\*\*Land must be integral to the project and must be from a willing seller.** The cost of complying with the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970 (the Uniform Act) is an eligible cost.

## **PROJECT LISTS**

**Appendix A: DWRP 2025 Project Eligibility List.** This list contains information on all projects for which an entity/public water system completed an eligibility survey in 2024. The eligibility survey is released annually to potential borrowers to capture 20-year capital improvement needs. Appendix A includes the name of the public water system, a description of the project, the population, the estimated cost of the project, and the type of project as described in the fund rules. Borrowers can add, modify, and remove projects on Appendix A by completing an eligibility survey in June of each year.

**Appendix B: DWRP 2025 Base and BIL Project Priority/Fundable List.** This is an inventory of projects that have started the SRF application process and may receive a loan in 2025 or that have recently received a loan in the Base DWRP or Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) program. Additionally, the list identifies projects that may receive BIL emerging contaminant or lead service line removal funding. This list includes an estimated project cost or approved loan amount, project description, preliminary disadvantaged community status, preliminary source of funding whether Base and/or BIL funding, and associated loan term and interest rate. Projects listed in this appendix have been assigned preliminary priority points. The priority point score in Appendix B is strictly preliminary, may reflect partial scoring, and is subject to change based on additional information from applicants and further scoring. Additionally, the priority rank on the list does not necessarily correspond to the order of funding and bypass of the order on the list is based on readiness to proceed by projects that complete all required steps according to the DWRP program procedures to submit an approvable loan application. Please refer to the Prioritization Procedures section below for detailed DWRP program procedures regarding prioritization. Emergency procedures (if needed) as described in the Emergency Procedures section of this IUP may prioritize funding for emergency projects. ## **CRITERIA, METHODS AND EVALUATION FOR DISTRIBUTION**

This section describes the application process including:

- Application procedures.
- Prioritization procedures.
- Loan approvals.
- How policies apply to the allocation of loan proceeds.
- The proposed federal fiscal year (2025 federal grant requirements, such as additional subsidy, Davis-Bacon and related acts, American iron and steel requirements, and project signage).

## APPLICATION PROCEDURES

The agencies accept loan applications throughout the year. The application deadlines shown in the schedule below correspond to an upcoming authority board meeting.

Applicants should coordinate with their assigned division project manager to understand program requirements to be met prior to loan application and to determine the appropriate application deadline to ensure board action and loan execution in a timely manner. Direct loans are requests of \$3 million or less, while leveraged loans are requests greater than \$3 million unless otherwise approved by the Authority board.

## PRIORITIZATION PROCEDURES

Attachment I: Drinking Water Revolving Fund Priority Scoring Model is used to determine project priority scoring. The DWRF program will provide projects a preliminary priority score at Pre-Qualification review, and a final score at the Project Needs Assessment approval. The score determined at PNA approval is valid for up to 12 months. If an applicant submits a loan application after the 12-month deadline, the applicant or their project manager may request rescoring ahead of the intended loan application date. The SRF committee may adjust the timing of issuing preliminary and final priority scoring and the timeframe for validity of the final scoring if needed. The final priority scoring will determine when a project may submit a loan application. Projects that score at or above the priority point threshold as listed below may apply at any loan cycle during the year (at both “Open” and “Limited” cycles as shown in the schedule below). Projects that score below the threshold may only apply at the “Open” cycles unless they meet one of the following exceptions:

- Applicants that meet requirements as a DWRF base program disadvantaged community (DAC) automatically score at or above the priority point threshold and may apply at any loan application deadline.
- Applicants that request only BIL Lead Service Line funding and/or only BIL Emerging Contaminants funding may apply at any loan application deadline (if an applicant requests Base plus BIL funds, the project must score at or above the priority point threshold).

The 2025 DWRF priority point threshold is: 110 points.

The following table provides the schedule of loan application deadlines, deadline type, loan type, and the Authority board meeting where loans that meet the corresponding deadline should be heard.

\*Limited to projects that score at or above the priority point threshold or meet exceptions as described above.

\*\*Leveraged loans are generally funded twice per year (spring and fall). January 5 is the last application date to submit for spring bond issue funding and June 5 is the last application date to submit for fall bond issue funding.

Following WQCC approval of this IUP in fall 2024, the DWRF program will issue priority point scoring for use in 2025 to all current projects in the application process. Final priority point scoring will be issued to projects that have received PNA approval, otherwise preliminary scoring will be provided. Throughout the year the authority board may review and adjust the priority point threshold and number of open and limited cycles as may be necessary to account for changes in funding capacity and program demand. Additionally, if funding requests exceed the available funds at any loan application deadline, further prioritization may be required. Further prioritization will consist of re-scoring all projects in a given cycle according to [Attachment I: Drinking Water Revolving Fund Priority Scoring Model](#) based on all current benchmarks.

Preliminary or final scoring provided at pre-qualification or PNA stages will not impact this scoring. In the event two or more applications tie based on priority scoring, the agencies will use the highest total affordability score to break the tie. If a tie remains, the agencies will use the total score for Drinking Water Quality & Public Health. If further tie breakers are required, the remaining categories of the priority scoring model will be used systematically until the tie is broken. Loan applicants that do not receive funding due to their rank may be considered at the next applicable loan application date at the applicant's request.

### LOAN APPROVALS

All loan approvals are valid for 18 months from the authority board approval date. Prioritized and approved loans that do not execute their loan within 18 months will be reprioritized upon the next application deadline as necessary and require new board approval. If an applicant submits for supplemental funding and the division determines the project is a necessary continuation of the originally proposed project, the entity may receive the same interest rate as the initial loan or the prevailing interest rate, whichever is lower. This provision is subject to the authority board



approval and the authority board may review and establish a time limit from the initial loan to when a supplemental loan application will remain under the same terms as the initial loan.

#### **ALLOCATION OF LOAN PROCEEDS**

The State Revolving Fund Program processes and procedures are set by the commission and the authority board. With input from the State Revolving Fund committee, the authority board determines the appropriate use of loan proceeds. Proceeds from loans, EPA capitalization grants, and administration fees are used to benefit communities through planning grants, design/engineering grants, principal forgiveness, disadvantaged community loans, direct loans, and leveraged loans.

#### **CAPITALIZATION GRANT**

For federal fiscal year 2025 and consistent with the 2024 appropriations language, the following requirements apply to each state receiving Drinking Water Revolving Fund capitalization grants. However, these may be subject to change based on new requirements:

- Additional subsidy.
- Davis-Bacon and related acts.
- American iron and steel requirements.
- Debarment and suspension.
- Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program.
- Williams-Steiger Occupational Safety and Health Act.
- Archeological and Historic Preservation Act.
- Environmental review - compliance with the state environmental review process.
- Signage.
- Build America, Buy America.

#### **Additional subsidy**

The 2024 Drinking Water Revolving Fund capitalization grant appropriation requires at least 26%, but no more than 49% of funds to be used by the state to provide additional subsidies to eligible recipients. The same requirement is assumed for 2025. The authority board determines the additional subsidy amount based on the capitalization grant conditions, guidance from the EPA, and alignment with program needs. Colorado provides additional subsidies to eligible disadvantaged communities (refer to the Disadvantaged Communities (DAC) Loan section) in the form of loan principal forgiveness. Amounts available will vary, and at times may not be available.

Colorado issues a portion of the additional subsidy for the design and engineering phase (see Design & Engineering Grants section). This provides an opportunity to assist disadvantaged communities with the design and engineering costs and to better prepare projects to move quickly to construction.

Loan principal forgiveness may be awarded at the loan approval phase for additional project costs, such as construction. The guidelines for issuing loan principal forgiveness at loan approval generally include:

- The amount of principal forgiveness awarded will be made during the loan approval phase and will occur throughout the year until all funds have been allocated.
- The authority board approves the amount of additional subsidy within the required EPA percentage range under the capitalization grant.
- The amount of loan principal forgiveness determined at loan approval is based on the required loan amount excluding any awarded grants or other funding. Final loan principal forgiveness amounts are subject to review and approval by the authority board.
- The amount of loan principal forgiveness will not count toward the direct loan limit.
- Based on the availability of funds and program demands, the authority board may establish a not to exceed amount per project as low as zero, or award additional amounts based on evaluation of financial need. Not to exceed amounts may differ between base program DACs and BIL eligible projects (refer to Attachment V) as determined by the authority board.
- Funds are available for Category 1 and 2 disadvantaged community loans.
- Loan principal forgiveness per project will be limited by the priority scoring model and the application of additional subsidization requirements (Attachments I and II).
- The loan principal forgiveness amount may be reduced if the loan amount is reduced after approval.
- Any remaining funds from 2024 will be distributed in calendar year 2025.
- Private non-profits are not eligible for principal forgiveness/additional subsidy.

If funds are unallocated from 2025, the agencies will issue funds to disadvantaged communities per the 2026 Drinking Water Revolving Fund Intended Use Plan.

### **Davis-Bacon and Related Acts**

The requirements of Section 1450(e) of the Safe Drinking Water Act (42 U.S.C. 300j-9(e)) regarding prevailing wage rates apply to the construction of treatment works carried out

in whole or in part with assistance made available by a state revolving loan fund as authorized by Section 1452 of the Safe Drinking Water Act (42 U.S.C. 300j (12)).

### **American Iron and Steel**

The capitalization grant requires implementation of the Safe Drinking Water Act, Section 1452 (a)(4) by requiring that all iron and steel products used for the construction, alteration, maintenance, or repair of a public water system are produced in the United States. This requirement applies to projects carried out in whole or in part with assistance made available by a state revolving fund loan.

### **Debarment and Suspension**

Recipients of EPA financial assistance agreements must not be presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any federal department or agency. The borrower must also ensure that any consultants, prime contractors, subcontractors, vendors, suppliers and manufacturers meet the requirements and are not excluded from covered transactions by any federal agency (as identified through the [System for Award Management](#)). The specific requirements with regards to debarment and suspension including verification through the System for Award Management are outlined in the EPA General Terms and Conditions for the capitalization grant.

### **Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program**

The goal of the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise program is to ensure there is equal opportunity in the award of federally assisted contracts. Recipients of EPA financial assistance agreements are required to seek and are encouraged to utilize small, minority-owned, women-owned, or disadvantaged businesses for project procurement. This requirement applies to equivalency-designated projects.

### **Williams-Steiger Occupational Safety and Health Act**

Recipients of EPA financial assistance agreements are required to ensure that all contractors working on project construction are subject to the provisions of the Williams-Steiger Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970.

### **Archeological and Historic Preservation Act**

Recipients of EPA financial assistance agreements are required to ensure that archeological discoveries, or discoveries of cultural significance, are protected through appropriate procedures.

### **Environmental Review - Compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act**

All proposed actions funded by the SRF program undergo an environmental review process to assess compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act and state environmental review process. The state, borrower, engineer, contractor and subcontractor have a duty to cooperate fully with federal and local governments and all other concerned public and private organizations, to use all practical means and measures, including financial and technical assistance, and to create and maintain conditions under which people and nature can exist in productive harmony, and promote the general welfare of the public.

### **Signage**

The EPA capitalization grant requires equivalency designated projects to comply with the SRF program signage guidance to enhance public awareness of EPA assistance agreements in Colorado. BIL-funded projects may also be subject to signage requirements.

### **Build America, Buy America Act**

Title IX of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law created the Build America, Buy America (BABA) Act domestic sourcing requirements for federal financial assistance programs for infrastructure, including the SRF programs. BABA requires that all iron, steel, and manufactured products used in a project are produced in the United States; and that all construction materials are manufactured in the United States. This requirement applies to projects carried out in whole or in part with assistance made available by a state revolving fund loan and applies to equivalency-designated projects.

### **Green Project Reserve**

Historically, the capitalization grant agreement required the SRF program to direct a portion of the capitalization grant toward projects that address green infrastructure, water efficiency, energy efficiency or other environmentally innovative activities. The 2024 capitalization grant does not require Green Project Reserve; therefore, the incentive will not be offered at this time. If the 2025 capitalization grant requires Green Project Reserve, the terms and conditions will be established by the authority board at that time.

### **Capitalization Grants and Re-loan Funds**

The SRF program executes loans funded with any available sources, grant or re-loan. Loans will not be designated solely as grant or re-loan funds. The program disburses funds based on whichever funds are available and needed at the time of the draws.

### **Miscellaneous**

The EPA capitalization grant may be allocated to any or all projects based on the amount of available funds and/or at the direction of the EPA. Equivalency requires the



application of all federal funding requirements to a given number of projects that total to a funding amount equivalent to that of the capitalization grant received by EPA. The capitalization grant allows equivalency projects to be designated by the state SRF program.

The application for the capitalization grant includes a proposed payment schedule using federal fiscal year 2024 funds. The payment schedule identifies the anticipated amount of EPA automated clearinghouse withdrawal from the capitalization grant and state dollars to be deposited into the fund.

The Colorado program will provide the necessary assurance and certifications as part of the capitalization grant agreement and operating agreement between Colorado and EPA. The Colorado program agrees to maintain compliance with the EPA Drinking Water State Revolving Fund SRF regulations, general EPA grant regulations, and all applicable federal cross-cutting requirements.

In accordance with federal statutes, states are authorized to provide loans at or below-market interest rates, including interest-free loans, at terms not to exceed the lesser of the following: 30 years or the project useful life (as determined by the state). The authority board can determine the interest rate and loan terms of the SRF programs at their discretion.

The SRF agencies input project data into the EPA SRF Data System to report key project characteristics and milestone information on a quarterly basis.

### **INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENT AND JOBS ACT / BIPARTISAN INFRASTRUCTURE LAW (BIL)**

The federal government passed the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law on November 15, 2021, providing additional funding to the State Revolving Funds (SRFs) for federal fiscal years 2022-2026. The state reviewed the federal infrastructure funding that was approved for the SRFs and developed an Addendum to the 2022 DWRF IUP to describe the requirements of the funding and the methods of distribution. The addendum was submitted for public comment and approved by the Water Quality Control Commission on June 14, 2022. The addendum has been incorporated into this IUP as Attachment V and updated for funds distribution in 2025.

### **DISADVANTAGED COMMUNITIES (DAC) LOANS**

Disadvantaged communities are defined by having a population of 10,000 or less and by meeting certain primary or a combination of primary and secondary factors. Government agencies determined to be disadvantaged are eligible for a reduced interest rate, design and engineering grants, and/or additional subsidy if available. Private non-profits determined to meet disadvantaged community criteria are eligible for a reduced interest rate and planning grants, but are not eligible for design & engineering grants or loan principal forgiveness/additional subsidy. Communities are evaluated for

disadvantaged community status after submittal of the project needs assessment and again at the time of loan application. The primary and secondary factors used for determination are described in detail below. Communities that did not qualify at the project needs assessment submittal may qualify at loan application, or other appropriate times, as determined by the SRF committee. The SRF agencies review disadvantaged community criteria, benchmarks and affordability on an annual basis to assess efficacy, as well as adjust benchmark thresholds based on the current statewide demographic data.

#### **PRIMARY AND SECONDARY FACTORS - DISADVANTAGED COMMUNITY**

Disadvantaged communities are classified as either Category 1 or Category 2. If a community meets any one of the three scenarios above, the community is a Category 1. If, at the time of loan application review, a community's Current and Projected System Debt to Median Home Value (MHV) and Required Revenue per Tap to Median Household Income (MHI) are greater than 80% of municipalities, then the applicant will be recommended to be a Category 2. The table below illustrates the loan terms and interest rate for each respective Category.

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\*The authority board typically determines interest rates on or before December 31st each year for the upcoming calendar year, however rates are subject to change throughout the year.

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### **BUSINESS CASE - DISADVANTAGED COMMUNITY**

In the event that a community's primary or secondary factor data does not represent recent, significant economic distress, or a scenario is marginally disqualifying, a business case may be presented to the authority board for an eligibility determination. The business case should be coordinated with the project team and be based on the factors the community has determined as not reflective of the community's current socio-economic or projected fiscal condition. A business case may be conducted after submittal of an acceptable Project Needs Assessment.

### **ELIGIBILITY PERIOD - DISADVANTAGED COMMUNITY**

An eligibility determination is valid for a period of 18 months from the date of the project needs assessment review letter, or other date, as determined by the SRF committee. Status will be re-determined if the applicant does not submit a complete loan application within 18 months.

All projects are evaluated by the SRF team at the time of the loan application to determine if they meet the criteria for Category 1 or Category 2 disadvantaged community status. Applicants that were qualified as a disadvantaged community at the project needs assessment will retain (or can improve) their status at the time of loan application, as long as the application has been submitted within the 18 months, as described in the eligibility determination section.

If a disadvantaged community submits for supplemental funding and the division determines the project a necessary continuation of the originally proposed project, the entity will continue to qualify as a disadvantaged community at the same category as the initial loan and will receive the original loan term, and either the same disadvantaged community interest rate as the initial loan, or the prevailing disadvantaged community interest rate, whichever is lower. This provision is subject to the authority board approval and the authority board may review and establish a time limit from the initial loan to when a supplemental loan application will remain under the same disadvantaged community determination and loan terms as the initial loan.



### **PLANNING GRANTS AND CONVERSION PLANNING GRANTS - DISADVANTAGED COMMUNITY**

The intent of the planning grant is to assist applicants with the costs of complying with program requirements such as project needs assessments, environmental assessments, energy audits, and the legal and accounting fees that may be associated with the formation of a government entity. Planning grants are only intended to assist disadvantaged communities that expect to come through the program. One planning grant of up to \$10,000 may be awarded per disadvantaged community, per project. The authority board may review and adjust the maximum planning grant amount if necessary. A conversion planning grant may be provided to assist with the costs of converting a privately owned for-profit or non-profit system into a governmental entity such as a special district, or a local or public improvement district for the purposes of financing an eligible project through the program, as well as the costs of complying with program requirements described above. An entity cannot receive both a planning grant and a conversion planning grant, and one conversion planning grant of up to \$25,000 may be awarded per disadvantaged community. Entities that meet the disadvantaged community criteria and have the project on the current year's Intended Use Plan (on Appendix A - Project Eligibility List) are eligible. Entities that meet the disadvantaged community criteria but are not listed in Appendix A - Project Eligibility List will be required to list the project on the subsequent year's project eligibility list to be considered. Planning grant requests are included as part of the pre-qualification process and are required to have a pre-qualification meeting with SRF program staff. Currently, both government agencies and private non-profits are eligible for planning grants. Business cases, as defined in the Intended Use Plan, will not be used for determining planning grant eligibility.

Planning grant invoices are paid at an 80:20 ratio to meet a 20% match requirement. Planning grant terms are no longer than one year, unless otherwise approved by the authority board or its executive director.

### **DESIGN & ENGINEERING GRANTS - DISADVANTAGED COMMUNITY**

Additional subsidies and BIL principal forgiveness for the federal fiscal year 2025 will be used to fund design and engineering activities for disadvantaged communities. A project, as approved in the project needs assessment, may be eligible for up to a \$300,000 design & engineering grant. The authority board may review and adjust the maximum design & engineering grant amount if necessary. The amount of the grant is determined by actual design and engineering fees relative to total project costs. Entities that meet the disadvantaged community criteria with the project on the current year Drinking Water Revolving Fund Intended Use Plan (in Appendix A - Project Eligibility List) are eligible for design & engineering grants. The applicant must submit a project needs assessment and an environmental determination checklist to initiate grant eligibility and consideration. Private non-profits are not eligible for design & engineering grants. If the demand for design & engineering grants is greater than the capacity of funds set aside

for the grants, the DWRF program may prioritize the issuance of design & engineering grants based on the applicant population. Applicants with a population of 5,000 or less will be prioritized ahead of applicants with a population greater than 5,000 until all funds have been allocated.

Design & engineering grant invoices are paid at an 80:20 ratio to meet a 20% match requirement. The 20% match portion shall be reimbursed upon execution of the project's Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan. Design & engineering grants are only intended to assist entities that expect to come through the program for loan funding. The Design & engineering grants have an 18-month expiration unless otherwise approved by the authority board or authority executive director.

### SPECIAL PROJECTS

The division and staff work together to support the following projects and activities:

- Online project management and project tracking system for program-funded projects.
- Enhance the Drinking Water Excellence Program.

### EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

The commission may amend Appendix A: DWRF 2025 Project Eligibility List and Appendix B: DWRF 2025 Base and BIL Project Priority/Fundable List at any time throughout the year to include projects that are determined to be emergency projects needed to prevent or address threats to public health. In cases where the commission determines amendments will result in substantial changes to Appendix A or Appendix B, the commission will provide public notice and an opportunity for comment on the proposed inclusions.

### SMALL SYSTEMS FUNDING GOAL

To the extent there are a sufficient number of eligible projects, the state will use at least 15% of monies credited to the fund account on an annual basis to provide loan assistance to systems serving 10,000 persons or less. It is anticipated that up to 69 small systems, with populations less than 10,000, are eligible for funding in 2024, for a total of up to \$533 million in project costs. To further the small system-funding goal in 2025, planning grants are available to assist small public water systems; and design & engineering grants are also available to assist small governmental public water systems. Small systems are subject to eligibility requirements for planning grants and design & engineering grants as discussed above.

### Financial Status

---

As of June 30, 2024, the agencies have awarded:

- 306 base program Drinking Water Revolving Fund direct loans totaling \$278,347,209.
- 12 Drinking Water Revolving Fund BIL supplemental direct loans totaling \$198,076,312.
- 50 Drinking Water Revolving Fund leveraged loans totaling \$568,436,594.
- 184 base program disadvantaged community loans totaling \$134,071,887 were administered, or are currently being administered, by the state.
- 3 Drinking Water Revolving Fund private non-profit public water system direct loans totaling \$4,925,000
- In addition, 24 American Recovery and Reinvestment Act loans including principal forgiveness totaling \$32,290,880 were administered by the state as of December 31, 2011.
- The total loan amount for the 368 loans is \$1,044,860,115.

The 1996 Amendments to the Safe Drinking Water Act authorized a federally capitalized Drinking Water Revolving Fund which was established in Colorado with the receipt of the first capitalization grant in September 1997. The state is required to match the total amount of the federal grant with a 20% contribution of state funds. The funds available are displayed in Appendix E: Funds Available to the DWRF Loan Program.

The SRF program provides low interest, low cost of issuance of direct loans. Direct loans are designed for smaller projects, at or under \$3 million, unless otherwise approved by the authority board. Direct loans in excess of \$3 million may be offered based on approval by the authority board. The direct loan sources are capitalization grant funds and/or re-loan funds.

Leveraged loans are designed primarily for investment-grade borrowers with projects over \$3 million. This type of loan is used as security for bonds that are sold to increase the fund's loan capacity. The loan source comes from capitalization grant funds, state match funds, and bond proceeds. In 2015, the program started issuing leveraged loans using a cash flow fund concept to further enhance the leveraging capabilities and liquidity of the fund. In the future, leveraged loan structures may use the cash flow or reserve fund model based on the authority board's decisions and current economic conditions. From July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2024, the leveraged loan interest rate was 70-85% of the market rate including the administrative fee of up to 1.50%. The authority board approved a subsidy range of 70% to 85%, therefore the leverage loan subsidy can vary within this range. The authority board may review and adjust the subsidy range and administrative fee during the year if needed. The market rate of bonds is determined on the day of sale as the all-in bond yield, or all costs considered, of the AAA-rated drinking water revenue bonds or state revolving fund bonds sold by the authority. The authority board determines the interest rate for direct loans and the interest rate subsidy for leveraged loans. The authority board may also adjust the

leveraged loan subsidy and establish a minimum interest rate floor for leveraged loans based on market conditions to maintain adequate administrative fees.

Administrative fee income is deposited into an account separate from the fund and is used for the agencies' staffing and operations expenses. Administrative fee income will continue to partially fund planning grants in 2025. Administrative fee income, as available, is used to reimburse the authority for state match funds deposited to the fund. The program reserves the right to accrue an administrative fee on all loans if it is determined that additional funds are needed to cover administrative costs and/or repay the state match provided by the authority. The authority board will establish the administrative fee percentage. Up to \$1 million of Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund administrative fees collected from loans may be transferred to the Drinking Water Revolving Fund to pay for administrative costs of the Drinking Water Revolving Fund.

Administrative fees received from Drinking Water Revolving Fund loans for 2024 are estimated at \$6,756,756. These funds are used for direct program costs, including but not limited to: legal fees, accounting fees, trustee fees, other consultant fees, labor and overhead allocations of the authority, division and DOLA. Total costs for administration of the fund are estimated at \$3,826,818 and exclude any state match repayment. A portion of the state match may be paid from Drinking Water Revolving Fund set-aside grant monies. Appendix F: Administrative Fee Account consists of a table showing the administrative fee account activity since inception.

Each year, the DWRF program compares eligibility list needs against the loan capacity of the fund. Current needs exceed \$24 billion. Continued leveraging assists more communities on the project eligibility list (Appendix A: DWRF 2024 Project Eligibility List) to achieve compliance with the Safe Drinking Water Act. To date, the leveraged loan rates have been in the range of 1.28% to 4.60%. Although no interest income on the grant funds and state match funds accrue to the fund from leveraged loans, the perpetual nature of the fund remains in place. For more detail, please see Attachment III: Estimated DWRF Loan Capacity for 2024.

Through June 30, 2024, the state received a total of \$638,814,600 in federal capitalization grants (including the \$6,666,667 transfer back to the Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund in 2003). Of this amount, \$137,488,113 was set aside for non-loan activities. A history of loans issued may be found in Appendix C: Loan Summary Report. The state expects to receive but is unable to anticipate, the amount and funding levels of the federal fiscal year 2025 capitalization grant. For appendices and table purposes, the 2024 amounts were assumed for 2025. The 2024 DWRF Capitalization Grant award is expected in late 2024. The program estimates a schedule for the signing of binding commitments (loan agreements) to be within three years from the receipt of the capitalization grant.

Appendix B: DWRF 2025 Base and BIL Project Priority / Fundable List includes 34 additional projects that completed a preliminary eligibility assessment in 2024 (through



August 2024). These 34 projects identified project costs of \$334,229,525. Based on the 2025 eligibility survey responses, 37 new projects were added to Appendix A, DWRP 2025 Project Eligibility List, in the amount of \$2,010,226,073.

### PROPORTIONALITY

The State of Colorado meets the proportionality regulations as required by the EPA.

### TRANSFER ACTIVITIES

As authorized by Congress, Section 302 of the Safe Drinking Water Act authorizes a state to transfer up to 33% of the capitalization grant (in a fiscal year) from one revolving fund to the other, i.e. from the Drinking Water Revolving Fund to the Water Pollution Control State Revolving Fund and vice-versa. In turn, 33% of the cumulative capitalization grants for federal fiscal years 1997-2024 (total DWRP grants at \$638,814,600) may be reserved from the Drinking Water Revolving Fund and transferred to the Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund and vice versa. For more details, refer to the table in Attachment IV: Net Funds Available for Transfer, which itemizes the amount of net State Revolving Fund program monies available for transfer between the two funds.

Based on the commission and governor's approval, a transfer of no more than \$10 million may be made in 2025. If a transfer is pursued, a stakeholder group will be notified of the state's intent to transfer funds. The exact amount of the transfer will be determined based on the demands of the two revolving funds. None of the transferred funds will be used for administrative purposes. With the statutory language approved by the Colorado State General Assembly in 2002, transfers can be made from one account to the other with appropriate approvals.

Given the low level of remaining grant monies in the fund, it is unlikely that the agencies will transfer grant funds from the Drinking Water Revolving Fund in 2025. However, if a transfer is pursued it is estimated that a transfer of \$5 - \$10 million to or from either fund would reduce the level of that program by an additional \$1 - \$2.5 million per year over the next 20 years. The Drinking Water Revolving Fund set-asides would not be affected, and the remainder of the allocation would be deposited into the revolving fund.

### CROSS-COLLATERALIZATION ACTIVITIES

Beginning in the calendar year 1999, the two revolving funds cross-collateralized or pledged monies on deposits in one fund act as additional security for bonds secured by monies on deposits in the other fund. The agencies utilized this mechanism for both programs in 1999 and, as a result, all three bond rating agencies upgraded the rating for both programs to AAA. This upgrade translates to lower interest rates, and therefore, more savings for the borrowers of both programs. These savings continue today.

## OPERATOR CERTIFICATION

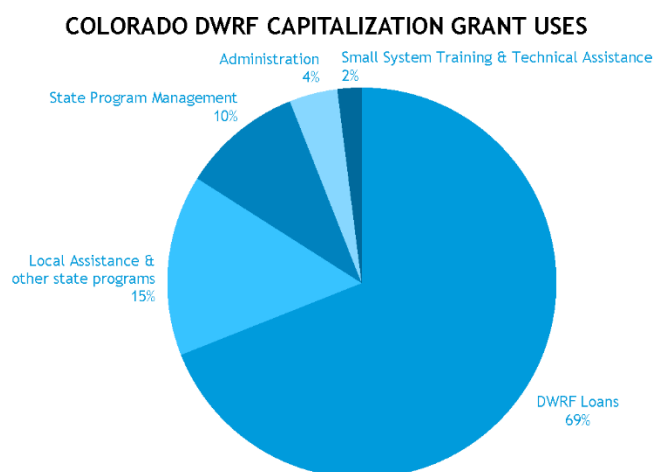
The 1996 amendments to the federal Safe Drinking Water Act required the states to develop certification programs for operators of water treatment plants and distribution systems. House Bill 00-1431 adopted by the Colorado General Assembly revised the existing Colorado operators certification program, in part to meet the new federal requirements. In accordance with revised state statute, the division and the Water and Wastewater Facility Operators Certification Board developed a program to implement federal requirements. HB20-1215 reauthorized the water and wastewater operator certification program through 2031. The EPA approved the program. More detail on the program may be found at the ([Facility operator certification](#)) webpage.

## PRIVATE NON-PROFIT PUBLIC WATER SYSTEMS

In May 2015, Governor Hickenlooper signed Senate Bill 15-121 that amended the authority's statute to allow private, non-profit public water systems, with projects listed on the Drinking Water Revolving Fund eligibility list, to receive financial assistance. The authority board approved the funding parameters and eligibility for private non-profit public water systems. These systems are considered the same as government agencies, with some exceptions as outlined in this IUP. Similar to government agencies, private, non-profit public water system projects are evaluated by the SRF team on a case-by-case basis and may require additional covenants and conditions to ensure the success of projects and the perpetuity of the Drinking Water Revolving Fund.

## SET-ASIDE ACTIVITIES

Colorado may set-aside up to 31 percent of the capitalization grant for non-project, or set-aside activities that are necessary to accomplish the requirements of the Safe Drinking Water Act. The division develops and submits work plans to EPA describing activities to be accomplished with the fund. The authority provides the 20% state match to receive the federal capitalization grant. Since the federal fiscal year 2002 grant, the 20% match for the set-aside portion comes from the loan administrative fee account.



It is the division's responsibility to determine the amount of funds necessary under each set-aside and to meet the obligations of the Safe Drinking Water Act. The financial status of the set-asides are summarized in Appendix D: Set-Aside Activity. The

administration of the 2024 set-aside funds are listed below. The division reviews set-aside budgets and spending on a regular basis in order to minimize any unliquidated obligations (ULOs), and to utilize set-aside funds within three years of receiving the funds.

The federal fiscal year 2025 capitalization grant amount is estimated at \$8,164,000 (assuming the same as 2024). A description of each set-aside and the funding earmarked is detailed below. These amounts are based on a reduction in the 2024 capitalization grant as a result of congressional earmarks and may not represent the final 2025 capitalization grant or the final set-asides the division will take in 2025. They have been included for planning purposes only. Based on the cuts to the DWRf capitalization grants; Administration & Technical Assistance, Small System Training & Technical Assistance, State Program Management, and Local Assistance & Other State Programs will be subsidized by the BIL DWRf Supplemental funding in order to preserve the base program funds. The activities described below for the base DWRf program will be funded through the BIL funding.

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#### ADMINISTRATION AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE SET-ASIDE (4%)

##### **Federal Fiscal Year 2025 - Not taking set asides, activities funded by BIL set asides as needed**

This supports ongoing administration of the fund and may also support technical assistance to public water systems (established if Colorado opts to submit an EPA-approved technical assistance work plan). Colorado intends to take the full set-aside if needed whether or not a technical assistance work plan is submitted and approved.

### ***Use of funds and expected accomplishments***

Funds are used to cover administrative and technical assistance expenses related to projects and activities authorized under the Safe Drinking Water Act, including the provision of technical assistance to public water systems as identified in the EPA-approved work plan. A technical assistance workplan if one is developed may include but is not limited the following activities and outputs:

- Collaborate with EPA supported technical assistance contractors regarding project development to assist drinking water systems in meeting the requirements to obtain funding through the SRF.
- Collaborate and coordinate with other funding providers throughout the state to address project affordability.
- Coordinate with the efforts of the Safe Drinking Water Program regarding technical review, inspections, compliance, and enforcement to ensure that funding is directed to the identified issues of concern.
- Partner with drinking water technical assistance providers, associations and other non-profit organizations to apply resources to assist systems of concern.

### **SMALL SYSTEM TRAINING AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE (SSTTA) (2%)**

**Federal Fiscal Year 2025 - Not taking set asides, activities funded by BIL set asides as needed**

This supports ongoing training and technical assistance to small systems serving less than 10,000 people established in the EPA-approved work plan focusing on the capacity development strategy.

### ***Use of funds and expected accomplishments***

Funds are used to provide technical assistance and training programs for small systems including but not limited to the following:

- Provide one-on-one water system training and technical assistance to small systems.
- Identify training needs (i.e. topics, locations, audience) using a variety of tools which include compliance and sanitary survey trends, operator test results, and the operator training framework.
- Coordinate training delivery with training partners.
- Create and provide basic operator training throughout the state.
- Identify and reach out to systems that would benefit from assistance and identify their capacity needs using a variety of tools (e.g. compliance and sanitary survey data, newly discovered systems).



- Prioritize systems to assist based on threat to public health, number impacted, and other factors.
- Coordinate assistance efforts with training partners.
- Track assistance efforts and system improvements made as a result of coaching.
- Program support tasks associated with drinking water contaminants of emerging concern.
- Maintain staff support related to training and assistance activities for small systems, including grant and contract management when activities are performed by a third-party.

### **STATE PROGRAM MANAGEMENT (10%)**

#### **Federal Fiscal Year 2025 - Not taking set asides, activities funded by BIL set asides as needed**

This supports administration of the state Public Water System Supervision (PWSS) program established in the EPA-approved state program management work plan.

#### ***Use of funds and expected accomplishments***

A portion of this set-aside will be used to support staff to accomplish Safe Drinking Water Act program requirements including:

- Data management system upgrades and maintenance.
- Improved system communication resulting in compliance progress and attainment.
- Effective program oversight, compliance assurance, enforcement, rule adoption, regulatory development, public water system assistance and capacity development.
- Staffing for engineering, compliance assurance, compliance assistance, rule management, data management, enforcement, administration, sampling, SWAP support, sanitary surveys, program management, contract oversight, early rule implementation, training and technical assistance and for implementing a capacity development strategy.
- Computer acquisition and employee expenses including furniture, vehicles, operational costs and indirect costs.

### **LOCAL ASSISTANCE AND OTHER STATE PROGRAMS (15%)**

#### **FEDERAL FISCAL YEAR 2025 - NOT TAKING SET ASIDES, ACTIVITIES FUNDED BY BIL SET ASIDES AS NEEDED**

This supports assistance for five activities: capacity development programs, wellhead protection program, source water protection activities (SWAP), SWAP land acquisition and SWAP implementation. Colorado intends to take the full set-aside based on the final capitalization grant award (15% from the capitalization grant). However, no more than 10% may be allocated for any single activity.

## **CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT (10%)**

**FEDERAL FISCAL YEAR 2025 - NOT TAKING SET ASIDES, ACTIVITIES FUNDED BY BIL SET ASIDES AS NEEDED**

This activity is to assist new and existing systems to achieve and maintain technical, managerial and financial capacity as well as to support SWAP activities.

### **Use of funds and expected accomplishments**

- Implement the Safe Drinking Water Program capacity development strategy.
- Support and maintain a source-water assessment and protection program (SWAP) which provides the public with information about their drinking water and creates a way for the community to get involved with protecting the quality of their drinking water.
- Provide continued one-on-one water system training and technical assistance.
- Utilize system self-reported data and information as well as the list of enforcement actions and input from compliance staff to proactively identify trends that suggest a system might lack technical, managerial or financial capacity and prioritize assistance efforts.
- Support and enhance the efforts of the Safe Drinking Water Program to monitor water system compliance via water quality laws and regulations to detect non-compliance and respond to violations quickly, fairly and consistently to limit the risk of harm to public health and the environment.
- Support and enhance the efforts of the Safe Drinking Water Program to conduct sanitary surveys of public water systems, review public water system designs for conformance with design criteria, prepare and distribute technical assistance materials and track system compliance with follow-up requirements.
- Collaborate with division staff to leverage and focus resources on systems with issues that are indicative of a lack of capacity. This may include but is not limited to disinfection, disinfection byproduct and/or radionuclide issues.
- Partner with drinking water technical assistance providers, associations and other non-profit organizations to apply resources to assist systems of concern.
- Support collaboration among all drinking water systems, assist smaller systems in understanding their problems and potential solutions. Use performance-based approaches to develop training.
- Support and enhance the efforts of the Safe Drinking Water Program to promote treatment process optimization and provide training and recognition for surface water treatment facilities in Colorado.
- Support and provide comprehensive cooperation in inspections, enforcement, compliance assistance, and technical assistance coaching where possible; conserve resources where practical.
- Provide technical expertise and assistance to local watershed initiatives, local governments, and community and non-community drinking water systems in

obtaining technical and financial assistance to develop, implement and ensure long-term success of source water protection plans.

- Conduct technical, managerial and financial capacity reviews for all new water systems and water systems applying for Drinking Water Revolving Fund loans to ensure these systems will operate into the future with fewer difficulties, be financially secure and managed with the best interests of the water users in mind.
- Enhance communication and collaboration with the Colorado operator certification program to ensure that available training services meet operator training needs and professional development goals. Identify and overcome barriers associated with cross-program work planning and coordination.
- Continue to foster partnerships through Colorado's water/wastewater agency response network and national incident management system initiative to promote security and all-hazards preparedness throughout the state's drinking water community.
- Maintain staff support related to the above activities, including grant and contract management when activities are performed by a third-party.

#### **WELLHEAD PROTECTION PROGRAM (WPP) (5%)**

#### **Federal Fiscal Year 2025 - Not taking set asides, activities funded by BIL set asides as needed**

This activity is to delineate and assess source water areas for groundwater systems, produce new wellhead protection/source water protection assessment reports as necessary, and support development and implementation of local source water protection plans.

#### ***Use of funds and expected accomplishments***

- Completion of new and/or revised ground water source water delineations.
- Enhanced groundwater susceptibility assessments to improve compliance.
- Improved ground water protection plans to minimize source contamination.
- Enhanced wellhead protection/source water assessment and protection data management.
- Enhanced community information and education.
- Improved data compilation and reporting.
- Financial and technical assistance to facilitate source water protection plans and address emerging contaminant issues.
- Coordinate and perform community and non-community groundwater sanitary surveys.
- Perform drinking water design reviews and/or level 2 assessments with consideration of source water protection.

- Provide technical assistance to public water systems concerning source water protection issues and how they may relate to proper water system operations.
- Compilation and reporting of the national source water protection measures to EPA via the Performance Accountability Report (PAR).

#### PUBLIC REVIEW AND COMMENT

On September 6, 2024, the commission published this Intended Use Plan and held an administrative action hearing on October 15, 2024, at which time the commission approved the state's 2025 Intended Use Plan, including the 2025 Drinking Water Revolving Fund project eligibility list (Appendix A) and project priority/fundable lists (Appendix B). The Intended Use Plan was made available for public comment one month prior to the administrative action hearing. The Intended Use Plans were posted for public comment on the Colorado Water Quality Control Commission website and comments were accepted via email. There were no written comments received during the public comment period on the 2025 DWRF IUP. During the annual project eligibility list survey process, the division contacted government agencies and private nonprofit entities to identify potential projects for the 2025 Drinking Water Revolving Fund Intended Use Plan. Each year, the division will update the plan to include additional Drinking Water Revolving Fund projects and other appropriate changes. The division will continually seek public review and comment for the proposed list of eligible projects and the Intended Use Plan will be brought to the commission for annual approval.

## **ATTACHMENT V: ADDENDUM TO THE 2025 DWRF INTENDED USE PLAN BIPARTISAN INFRASTRUCTURE LAW**

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL), previously referred to as the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, was signed into law on November 15, 2021. The BIL invests more than \$50 billion over the next five years in EPA water infrastructure programs including the SRF. Colorado's 2024 allotment from the BIL for the DWRF program totals approximately \$82 million and the 2025 allotment is assumed to be the same for the purposes of this IUP.

This attachment describes the DWRF program requirements to distribute DWRF BIL funding in 2025, and for the distribution of BIL funds in 2025. The existing (base) 2025 DWRF Program remains in place and any changes to the base program or requirements are outlined in this attachment.

The BIL funding will be issued through the DWRF in three categories: 1) DWRF BIL General Supplemental Funding, 2) DWRF BIL Emerging Contaminants Funding, and 3) DWRF BIL Lead Service Line Funding. The IUP amendments and the BIL funding categories are described below.

### **BIL FUNDING CATEGORIES AND USE OF FUNDS**

#### **DWRF BIL General Supplemental Funding**

The BIL is anticipated to include a general supplemental funding allotment for FFY 2025 to Colorado of \$40.26 million (estimated based on the 2024 DWRF BIL General Supplemental award) for the DWRF program. The existing DWRF program as described in this IUP applies to this funding category and includes the following:

#### **Eligibility**

- Eligible entities and projects for this funding must be eligible under the existing DWRF program.
- All eligible projects for this allotment must be listed on the existing Appendix A Drinking Water Revolving Fund 2025 Project Eligibility List.

#### **Requirements**

- Application, prioritization, and approval for funding will be the same as the existing DWRF program.
- State match is 20% of the total amount of the capitalization grant in fiscal year 2025. The authority has historically provided the state match to receive the federal capitalization grant; however, the state legislature may also provide the matching funds to meet the requirement.
- 49% of the capitalization grant amount may be issued as additional subsidization in the form of principal forgiveness and/or grants. The authority board of directors may direct additional subsidization from the DWRF BIL supplemental

funding to Design and Engineering grants as described in the base program ([see Design & Engineering Grants-Disadvantaged Communities](#)) as needed in order to subsidize the cuts to the base DWRF program. Additional subsidization may be provided to eligible entities that meet the DWRF BIL Principal Forgiveness Eligibility Criteria, as confirmed by the authority board.

- The authority board of directors may establish a maximum award amount, which may include a maximum number of times an entity can access funding from this category, based on program demand, and loan interest rate and terms will be determined by the board based on market conditions. In times of high demand, maximum award amounts for principal forgiveness may be as low as \$0.
- Distribution of funding:
  - Applicants with eligible projects meeting the DWRF BIL principal forgiveness eligibility criteria may qualify to receive BIL funds at a flat loan/principal forgiveness combination. Applicants with project costs exceeding a maximum award amount, if one is established by the authority board, or exceeding available funds, may receive funds for the remaining project costs through the base program. Additionally, applicants meeting the base program DAC criteria may be eligible for additional principal forgiveness from the base program if funds are available. Private non-profits are not eligible for BIL principal forgiveness/additional subsidy.

### **Set-Aside Activities for DWRF BIL General Supplemental Funding**

Similar to the DWRF base (existing) program, Colorado may set aside up to 31% of the capitalization grant for non-project, or set-aside activities that are necessary to accomplish the requirements of the Safe Drinking Water Act. Work plans are developed and submitted to EPA describing activities to be accomplished with the fund.

In 2024, the DWRF base program capitalization grant was reduced (62% cut from 2021), which is the appropriation the Safe Drinking Water Program relies on to operate the program. Therefore, if the 2025 base program grant is also reduced, a portion of the set-asides from this BIL funding will be used to supplement program needs. It is the division's responsibility to determine the amount of funds necessary under each set-aside and to meet the obligations of the Safe Drinking Water Act.

The 2024 BIL DWRF appropriation was \$40,265,000 and the 2025 appropriation is assumed to be the same for set-aside amounts below. Additionally, if the 2025 DWRF base program capitalization grant award is reduced similar to 2024, the division intends to subsidize the base program set-asides with BIL set-asides as detailed below. The division may adjust the amounts estimated below for set-asides at the time of application, but reserves the full amount allowed (as indicated by the percentages in the headings) for each set aside if needed in this Intended Use Plan.

## **Administration and Technical Assistance Set-Aside (4%)**

### **2025 BIL Funding - Requested Amount \$1,610,600**

This is to support ongoing administration of the fund and may also support technical assistance to public water systems (established if Colorado opts to submit an EPA-approved technical assistance work plan). Colorado estimates taking the required amount to supplement any cuts to the base capitalization grant as needed (the original 2021 base capitalization grant amount was \$21,735,000), and will reserve any remaining amount depending on the availability of match funds and the identified needs as the BIL program is implemented.

#### ***Use of funds and expected accomplishments***

Funds are used to cover administrative and technical assistance expenses related to projects and activities authorized under the Safe Drinking Water Act, including the provision of technical assistance to public water systems as identified in the EPA-approved work plan. This set-aside will support administration of the funding including but not limited to project management and review of all project submittals throughout the life cycle of a project. This includes the improvement and development of comprehensive program project management software as needed by the program to maintain effective oversight of all SRF requirements related to the loan and project. Use of these funds for comprehensive program project management software is eligible as the software supports all program projects inclusive projects funded by the base DWRF and BIL supplemental funding. A technical assistance work plan if one is developed may include but is not limited the following activities and outputs:

- Collaborate with EPA-supported technical assistance contractors regarding project development to assist drinking water systems in meeting the requirements for obtaining funding through the SRF.
- Collaborate and coordinate with other funding providers throughout the state to address project affordability.
- Coordinate with the efforts of the Safe Drinking Water Program regarding technical review, inspections, compliance, and enforcement to ensure that funding is directed to the identified issues of concern.
- Partner with drinking water technical assistance providers, associations, and other non-profit organizations to apply resources to assist systems of concern.

## **SMALL SYSTEM TRAINING AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE (SSTTA) (2%)**

### **2025 BIL Funding - Requested Amount \$737,680**

This is to support ongoing training and technical assistance to small systems serving less than 10,000 people established in the EPA-approved work plan focusing on the capacity development strategy. Colorado estimates taking the required amount to supplement

any cuts to the base capitalization grant as needed (the original 2021 base capitalization grant amount was \$21,735,000), and will reserve any remaining amount depending on the availability of match funds and the identified needs as the BIL program is implemented.

#### ***Use of funds and expected accomplishments***

Funds are used to provide technical assistance and training programs for small systems including but not limited to the following:

- Provide one-on-one water system training and technical assistance to small systems.
- Identify training needs (i.e. topics, locations, audience) using a variety of tools which include compliance and sanitary survey trends, operator test results, and the operator training framework.
- Coordinate training delivery with training partners.
- Create and provide basic operator training throughout the state.
- Identify and reach out to systems that would benefit from assistance and identify their capacity needs using a variety of tools (e.g. compliance and sanitary survey data, newly discovered systems).
- Prioritize systems to assist based on threat to public health, number impacted, and other factors.
- Coordinate assistance efforts with training partners.
- Track assistance efforts and system improvements made as a result of coaching.
- Program support tasks associated with drinking water contaminants of emerging concern.
- Maintain staff support related to training and assistance activities for small systems, including grant and contract management when activities are performed by a third party.

#### **STATE PROGRAM MANAGEMENT (10%)**

##### **2025 BIL Funding - Requested Amount \$3,200,000**

This is to cover the administration of the state Public Water System Supervision (PWSS) program established in the EPA-approved state program management work plan.

Colorado estimates taking the required amount to supplement any cuts to the base capitalization grant as needed (the original 2021 base capitalization grant amount was \$21,735,000), and will reserve any remaining amount depending on the availability of match funds and the identified needs as the BIL program is implemented.

#### ***Use of funds and expected accomplishments***

A portion of this set-aside will be used to support staff in accomplishing Safe Drinking Water Act program requirements including:



- Data management system upgrades and maintenance.
- Improved system communication resulting in compliance progress and attainment.
- Effective program oversight, compliance assurance, enforcement, rule adoption, regulatory development, public water system assistance, and capacity development.
- Staffing for engineering, compliance assurance, compliance assistance, rule management, data management, enforcement, administration, sampling, SWAP support, sanitary surveys, program management, contract oversight, early rule implementation, training and technical assistance, and for implementing a capacity development strategy.
- Computer acquisition and employee expenses including furniture, vehicles, operational costs, and indirect costs.

#### **LOCAL ASSISTANCE AND OTHER STATE PROGRAMS (15%)**

##### **2025 BIL Funding - Requested Amount \$4,100,000**

This is to provide assistance with five activities: capacity development programs, the wellhead protection program, source water protection activities (SWAP), SWAP land acquisition, and SWAP implementation. Colorado estimates taking the required amount to supplement any cuts to the base capitalization grant as needed (the original 2021 base capitalization grant amount was \$21,735,000), but will reserve any remaining amount depending on the availability of match funds and the identified needs as the BIL program is implemented. The amount of the request below reflects 15% from the capitalization grant. However, no more than 10% may be allocated for any single activity. See the estimated requested amounts and targets below.

#### **CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT (10%)**

##### **2025 BIL Funding - Requested Amount \$3,000,000**

This activity is to assist new and existing systems to achieve and maintain technical, managerial and financial capacity as well as to support SWAP activities.

##### ***Use of funds and expected accomplishments***

- Implement the Safe Drinking Water Program capacity development strategy.
- Support and maintain a source-water assessment and protection program (SWAP) which provides the public with information about their drinking water, emerging contaminants, and creates a way for the community to get involved with protecting the quality of their drinking water.
- Provide continued one-on-one water system training and technical assistance.
- Utilize system self-reported data and information as well as the list of enforcement actions and input from compliance staff to proactively identify

trends that suggest a system might lack technical, managerial, or financial capacity and prioritize assistance efforts.

- Support and enhance the efforts of the Safe Drinking Water Program to monitor water system compliance via water quality laws and regulations to detect non-compliance and respond to violations quickly, fairly and consistently to limit the risk of harm to public health and the environment.
- Support and enhance the efforts of the Safe Drinking Water Program to conduct sanitary surveys of public water systems, review public water system designs for conformance with design criteria, prepare and distribute technical assistance materials and track system compliance with follow-up requirements.
- Collaborate with division staff to leverage and focus resources on systems with issues that are indicative of a lack of capacity. This may include but is not limited to disinfection, disinfection byproduct and/or radionuclide issues.
- Provide a Technical, Managerial, and Financial (TMF) evaluation for PWS receiving technical assistance to evaluate areas for improvement, help decision makers and operators to take a holistic view of their system, and document improvement over time
- Coordinate assistance efforts with training partners and division staff to ensure all aspects of TMF are being addressed and the system stays in compliance long-term
- Create opportunities for asset management improvement with every coaching visit regardless of the initial request of the system.
- Partner with drinking water technical assistance providers, associations, and other non-profit organizations to apply resources to assist systems of concern.
- Support collaboration among all drinking water systems, assist smaller systems in understanding their problems and potential solutions. Use performance-based approaches to develop training.
- Support and enhance the efforts of the Safe Drinking Water Program to promote treatment process optimization and provide training and recognition for surface water treatment facilities in Colorado.
- Support and provide comprehensive cooperation in inspections, enforcement, compliance assistance, and technical assistance coaching where possible; conserve resources where practical.
- Provide technical expertise and assistance to local watershed initiatives, local governments, and community and non-community drinking water systems in obtaining technical and financial assistance to develop, implement, and ensure long-term success of source water protection plans.
- Conduct technical, managerial, and financial capacity reviews for all new water systems and water systems applying for Drinking Water Revolving Fund loans to ensure these systems will operate into the future with fewer difficulties, be

financially secure and managed with the best interests of the water users in mind.

- Enhance communication and collaboration with the Colorado operator certification program to ensure that available training services meet operator training needs and professional development goals. Identify and overcome barriers associated with cross-program work planning and coordination.
- Continue to foster partnerships through Colorado's water/wastewater agency response network and national incident management system initiative to promote security and all-hazards preparedness throughout the state's drinking water community.
- Maintain staff support related to the above activities, including grant and contract management when activities are performed by a third party.

### **WELLHEAD PROTECTION PROGRAM (WPP) (5%)**

#### **2025 BIL Funding - Requested Amount \$1,100,000**

This activity is to delineate and assess source water areas for groundwater systems, produce new wellhead protection/source water protection assessment reports as necessary, and support development and implementation of local source water protection plans.

#### ***Use of funds and expected accomplishments***

- Completion of new and/or revised ground water source water delineations.
- Evaluate emerging contaminant threats to drinking water sources.
- Enhanced groundwater susceptibility assessments to improve compliance.
- Improved ground water protection plans to minimize source contamination.
- Enhanced wellhead protection/source water assessment and protection data management.
- Enhanced community information and education.
- Assist public water systems with assessing, informing customers (if applicable), and reducing exposure from emerging contaminants.
- Improved data compilation and reporting.
- Financial and technical assistance to facilitate source water protection plans.
- Coordinate and perform community and non-community groundwater sanitary surveys.
- Perform drinking water design reviews and/or Level 2 assessments with consideration of source water protection.
- Provide technical assistance to public water systems concerning source water protection issues and how they may relate to proper water system operations.

- Compilation and reporting of the national source water protection measures to EPA via the Performance Accountability Report (PAR).

### **DWRF BIL EMERGING CONTAMINANTS FUNDING**

The BIL is anticipated to include a funding allocation in FFY 2025 to Colorado of \$13.38 million (estimated based on the 2024 DWRF BIL Emerging Contaminants award) to be applied to drinking water emerging contaminant projects.

#### **Eligibility**

- Entities and projects eligible for this funding must be eligible under the existing DWRF program and the primary purpose must be to address emerging contaminants in drinking water.
- All eligible projects for this allotment must be listed on the existing Appendix A Drinking Water Revolving Fund 2025 Project Eligibility List
- Eligible emerging contaminants include perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS), manganese, and contaminants on EPA's [Contaminant Candidate Lists](#). Additional eligibility details and requirements for this category are defined in the [EPA BIL SRF Implementation Memo](#) dated March 8, 2022.

#### **Requirements**

- Application, prioritization, and approval for funding will be the same as the existing DWRF program.
- State match is not required.
- 100% of the capitalization grant amount, net of set-asides taken, will be issued as additional subsidization in the form of principal forgiveness and/or grants. At least 25% of these funds must be provided to entities meeting the DWRF BIL Principal Forgiveness Eligibility Criteria, as confirmed by the authority board, or communities with populations less than 25,000.
- The authority board of directors may establish a maximum award amount based on program demand, which may include a maximum number of times an entity can access funding from this category. In times of high demand, maximum award amounts for principal forgiveness may be as low as \$0.
- Distribution of funding:
  - Twenty-five percent of funds from this category must go to communities meeting the DWRF BIL Principal Forgiveness Eligibility Criteria, as confirmed by the authority board, or communities with populations less than 25,000. Seventy-five percent of funds can go to any eligible borrower. Applicants with project costs exceeding a maximum award amount, if one is established by the authority board, exceeding available funds, or with project components unrelated to addressing emerging contaminants, may receive funds for the remaining project costs through the DWRF supplemental or base programs. Additional principal forgiveness may be

available from the DWRP supplemental or base programs for applicants meeting DWRP BIL Principal Forgiveness Eligibility Criteria or base program DAC criteria. Private non-profits are not eligible for BIL principal forgiveness/additional subsidy.

### **SET-ASIDE ACTIVITIES FOR DWRP BIL EMERGING CONTAMINANTS FUNDING**

Colorado may set aside up to 31% of the capitalization grant for non-project, or set-aside activities that are necessary to accomplish the requirements specifically for implementing Emerging Contaminants. It is the division's responsibility to determine the amount of funds necessary under each set-aside and to meet the obligations of the Safe Drinking Water Act and the provisions in the BIL funding. The 2024 BIL DWRP Emerging Contaminants appropriation was \$13,384,000 and 2025 appropriation is assumed to be the same. The division may adjust the amounts estimated below for set-asides at the time of application, but reserves the full amount allowed (as indicated by the percentages in the headings) for each set aside if needed in this Intended Use Plan.

### **ADMINISTRATION AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE SET-ASIDE (4%)**

#### **2025 BIL Funding - Requested Amount \$350,000**

This is to support ongoing administration of the fund and may also support technical assistance to public water systems (established if Colorado opts to submit an EPA-approved technical assistance work plan). Colorado intends to take the set-aside as needed whether or not a technical assistance work plan is submitted and approved.

#### ***Use of funds and expected accomplishments***

Funds are used to cover administrative and technical assistance expenses related to projects and activities authorized under the Safe Drinking Water Act, including the provision of technical assistance to public water systems as identified in the EPA-approved work plan. This set-aside will support administration of the funding including but not limited to project management and review of all project submittals throughout the life cycle of a project. This includes improvement and development of comprehensive program project management software as needed by the program to maintain effective oversight of all SRF requirements related to the loan and project. Use of these funds for comprehensive program project management software is eligible as the software supports all program projects inclusive projects funded by the BIL emerging contaminant funds. A technical assistance workplan if one is developed may include but is not limited the following activities and outputs:

- Collaborate with EPA-supported technical assistance contractors regarding project development to assist drinking water systems in meeting the requirements to obtain funding through the SRF specifically with regards to available Emerging Contaminants funding.

- Collaborate and coordinate with other funding providers throughout the state to address project affordability. This would include coordination with the EPA WIIN Emerging Contaminants in Small or Disadvantaged Communities (EC-SDC) grant program.
- Coordinate with the efforts of the Safe Drinking Water Program regarding communications, training, and understanding with regards to addressing emerging contaminants for projects that may receive funding.
- Partner with drinking water technical assistance providers, associations, and other non-profit organizations to apply resources to assist systems of concern.

#### **SMALL SYSTEM TRAINING AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE- NOT SETTING ASIDE FUNDING**

#### **STATE PROGRAM MANAGEMENT (10%)**

##### **2025 BIL Funding - Requested Amount \$900,000**

This amount covers the administration of the state Public Water System Supervision (PWSS) program used to cover staff directly working on the implementation of emerging contaminants.

##### ***Use of funds and expected accomplishments***

A portion of this set-aside will be used to support staff to accomplish Safe Drinking Water Act program requirements including:

- Data management system upgrades and maintenance related to emerging contaminants.
- Improved system communication resulting in compliance progress and attainment related to emerging contaminants.
- Effective program oversight, compliance assurance, enforcement, rule adoption, regulatory development, public water system assistance, and capacity development related to emerging contaminants.
- Staffing for engineering, compliance assurance, compliance assistance, rule management, data management, enforcement, administration, sampling, SWAP support, sanitary surveys, program management, contract oversight, early rule implementation, training and technical assistance, and for implementing a capacity development strategy related to emerging contaminants.



## LOCAL ASSISTANCE AND OTHER STATE PROGRAMS - NOT SETTING ASIDE FUNDING

### **DWRF BIL Lead Service Line Funding**

The BIL is anticipated to include a supplemental funding allotment in FFY 2025 to Colorado of \$32.80 million (estimated based on the 2024 DWRF BIL Lead Service Line Funding award) to be applied to the lead service line replacement projects.

#### **Eligibility**

- Entities and projects eligible for this funding must be eligible under the existing DWRF program and be a lead service line replacement (LSLR) project or associated activity directly connected to the identification, planning, design, and replacement of lead service lines.
- All eligible projects for this allotment must be listed on the existing Appendix A Drinking Water Revolving Fund 2025 Project Eligibility List.
- Additional eligibility requirements for this category of funding are defined in the [EPA BIL SRF Implementation Memo](#) dated March 8, 2022.

#### **Requirements**

- Application, prioritization and approval will be the same as the existing DWRF program.
- State match is not required
- 49% of the capitalization grant amount may be issued as additional subsidization in the form of principal forgiveness and/or grants. Additional subsidization may be provided to eligible entities that meet the DWRF BIL Principal Forgiveness Eligibility Criteria, as confirmed by the authority board.
- The authority board of directors may establish a maximum award amount, which may include a maximum number of times an entity can access funding from this category, based on program demand; and loan interest rate and terms will be determined by the board based on market conditions. In times of high demand, maximum award amounts for principal forgiveness may be as low as \$0.
- Distribution of funding
  - Applicants with eligible projects meeting the DWRF BIL principal forgiveness eligibility criteria may qualify to receive BIL funds at a flat loan/principal forgiveness combination. Applicants with project costs exceeding a maximum award amount, if one is established by the authority board, exceeding available funds, or with project components unrelated to lead service line identification and replacement, may receive funds for the remaining project costs through the DWRF supplemental or base programs. Additional principal forgiveness may be available from the DWRF supplemental or base programs for applicants meeting DWRF BIL principal

forgiveness eligibility criteria or base program DAC criteria. Private non-profits are not eligible for BIL principal forgiveness/additional subsidy.

### **SET-ASIDE ACTIVITIES FOR DWRF BIL LEAD SERVICE LINE FUNDING**

Colorado may set aside up to 31% of the capitalization grant for non-project, or set-aside activities that are necessary to accomplish the requirements specifically for implementing lead service line replacement. It is the division's responsibility to determine the amount of funds necessary under each set-aside and to meet the obligations of the Safe Drinking Water Act and the provisions in the BIL funding.

The 2024 BIL DWRF Lead Service Line appropriation was \$32,800,000 and the 2025 appropriation is assumed to be the same. The division may adjust the amounts estimated below for set-asides at the time of application, but reserves the full amount allowed (as indicated by the percentages in the headings) for each set aside if needed in this Intended Use Plan.

### **ADMINISTRATION AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE SET-ASIDE (4%)**

#### **2025 BIL Funding - Requested Amount \$600,000**

These monies support ongoing administration of the fund and may also support technical assistance to public water systems (established if Colorado opts to submit an EPA-approved technical assistance work plan). Colorado intends to take the set-aside if needed whether or not a technical assistance work plan is submitted and approved.

#### ***Use of funds and expected accomplishments***

Funds are used to cover administrative and technical assistance expenses related to projects and activities authorized under the Safe Drinking Water Act, including the provision of technical assistance to public water systems as identified in the EPA-approved work plan. This set-aside will support administration of the funding including but not limited to project management and review of all project submittals throughout the life cycle of a project. This includes the improvement and development of comprehensive program project management software as needed by the program to maintain effective oversight of all SRF requirements related to the loan and project. Use of these funds for comprehensive program project management software is eligible as the software supports all program projects inclusive projects funded by the BIL lead service line funds. A technical assistance workplan if one is developed may include but is not limited the following activities and outputs:

- Collaborate with EPA-supported technical assistance contractors regarding project development to assist drinking water systems in meeting the requirements to obtain funding through the SRF specifically with regards to available lead service line funding.

- Collaborate and coordinate with other funding providers throughout the state to address project affordability.
- Coordinate with the efforts of the Safe Drinking Water Program regarding technical review, inspections, compliance, and enforcement to ensure that funding is directed to the identified issues of concern.
- Partner with drinking water technical assistance providers, associations and other non-profit organizations to apply resources to assist systems of concern.

### **SMALL SYSTEM TRAINING AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE -NOT SETTING ASIDE FUNDING** **STATE PROGRAM MANAGEMENT (10%)**

#### **2025 BIL Funding - Requested Amount \$3,280,000**

This amount covers the administration of the state Public Water System Supervision (PWSS) program used to cover staff directly working on the implementation of lead service line replacement.

#### *Use of funds and expected accomplishments*

A portion of this set-aside will be used to support staff to accomplish Safe Drinking Water Act program requirements including:

- Data management system upgrades and maintenance related to lead service line replacement.
- Improved system communication resulting in compliance progress and attainment related to lead service line replacement.
- Effective program oversight, compliance assurance, enforcement, rule adoption, regulatory development, public water system assistance, and capacity development related to lead service line replacement.
- Staffing for engineering, compliance assurance, compliance assistance, rule management, data management, enforcement, administration, sampling, SWAP support, sanitary surveys, program management, contract oversight, early rule implementation, training and technical assistance, and for implementing a capacity development strategy related to lead service line replacement.
- Technical and program support for lead service line inventories.

### **LOCAL ASSISTANCE AND OTHER STATE PROGRAMS - NOT SETTING ASIDE FUNDING**

#### **DWRF BIL Principal Forgiveness Eligibility Criteria**

An eligible applicant may receive BIL funds with principal forgiveness in the DWRF BIL Supplemental General Supplemental Funding, DWRF BIL Emerging Contaminants Funding, and DWRF BIL Lead Service Line Funding if:

1. Applicant qualifies as a base (existing) program DAC

**OR**

- 2. Applicant scores a sum of three (3) points using the below criteria:**
1. Population loss or growth slower than the state's over 5 years (benchmark is 1%). **(1 point)**
  2. Total possible score of 1 point
    - a. County-level job loss over 10-years. **(0.5 points)**
    - b. Counties with  $\geq$  a 24-month average unemployment rate that exceeds the state's plus 1% (benchmark is 5.61%). **(0.5 points)**
  3. Community Median Household Income is less than the State Median Household Income (benchmark is \$80,184): **(1 point)**. Community Median Household Income that exceeds 125% of the State Median Household Income (benchmark is \$100,230) will lose one point **(-1 point)**.
  4. Rates compared to Median Household Income exceed the ratio of estimated annual median rates to state Median Household Income. Benchmarks are 1.44% for combined sewer and drinking water, 0.83% for water, and 0.60% for sewer. **(1 point)**
  5. Project addresses removal of lead or emerging contaminants as these water quality contaminants contribute to environmental risk factors and health disparities. **(1 point)**
  6. Percentage of the population within a community that identifies as minority is greater than 40%. **(1 point)**
  7. Percentage of population within a community that is housing-burdened is greater than 50%. **(1 point)**
  8. Percentage of the population within a community living under 200% of the poverty level is greater than 40%. **(1 point)**
  9. Combined percent of population living under 200% of poverty level + percent of population over 65 years is greater than or equal to two-thirds of communities in the state (benchmark is 55.00%). **(1 point)**

**Notes:**

- BIL eligibility is subject to confirmation by the authority board.
- Eligible applicants must be an eligible entity under the existing DWRF program. Private non-profit entities are not eligible for principal forgiveness.
- Above criteria is applicable to 25% of DWRF BIL Emerging Contaminants Funding.
- A community may be evaluated using place, block group, tract, or county-level data, or a combination. The criteria benchmarks listed above will be updated annually and the benchmarks shown may not reflect the most current benchmarks.
- Principal Forgiveness not to exceed amounts may be as low as zero and may differ between base program DAC and BIL-eligible projects as determined by the authority board.

**BIL Principal Forgiveness eligibility determinations and timing:**

Eligibility for BIL Principal Forgiveness (PF) will be determined when a pre-qualification application is submitted, but is subject to confirmation by the authority board at loan approval. At times, the authority board may request further evaluation of eligibility when scoring does not appear to adequately reflect the intent of the criteria. Eligibility will be noted in the pre-qualification review letter. Loan applications received within 18 months of the date of the pre-qualification meeting will be eligible for BIL PF, subject to not to exceed amounts as set by the authority board. Loan applications received after that period or that did not qualify during the initial determination will be evaluated again for PF eligibility.

For applicants that do not meet the BIL PF eligibility criteria, a business case can be drafted and presented to the authority board after Pre-qualification or Project Needs Assessment submission. SRF project staff will work with the prospective applicant to determine the appropriate timing. If approved by the authority board, the loan application must be received within 18 months from the date of approval.

**FUNDABLE LIST AND USE OF FUNDS**

The EPA requires the IUP to identify projects that are anticipated to be funded for which the total cost of assistance requested is at least equal to the amount of the grant being applied for. Appendix B - DWRF 2025 Base and BIL Project Priority/Fundable List is a subset of projects that exist on the 2025 DWRF Appendix A - Project Eligibility List but may receive funding in 2025 because they have started the SRF application process or have applied for or recently received a loan. Since the BIL provides additional funding specifically for lead service line (LSL) replacement and emerging contaminants (EC), the fundable list indicates which projects may receive funding in 2025 from the BIL supplemental funds, BIL LSL funds, and the BIL EC funding. Projects on the Appendix B - DWRF 2025 Base and BIL Project Priority/Fundable List may result in funding from both BIL and base program funding. The fundable lists include a preliminary disadvantaged community status and preliminary priority point scoring score. However, those are strictly preliminary and subject to change based on additional information from applicants. It is important to note that any project on the 2025 DWRF Appendix A - Project Eligibility List is eligible to apply for funding in 2025. The fundable lists are intended to indicate what projects are more likely to be funded in the current year, and indicate to EPA that there is sufficient project demand to spend the EPA capitalization grants. Please note that the application, prioritization, and approval for funding through the BIL is the same as the base DWRF program and is described in Pgs. 5-7 of this IUP. Appendix B is located in the appendices of this IUP.

In addition, the EPA requires the IUP to include a table identifying all funding sources and uses of funds that are available to the program. As the BIL provides additional

funding to the program in 2025, the sources and uses table includes the BIL funding. The 2025 DWRF IUP Appendix E - Funds Available to the DWRF Loan Program is included in the appendices.

### **BIL FUNDING APPLICABLE PROVISIONS AND ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS**

All provisions promulgated through statute, guidance, or regulations issued by EPA for the implementation of the WPCRF and DWRF programs will remain in effect (e.g. American Iron and Steel and Davis-Bacon related prevailing wage requirements) unless they are inconsistent with the BIL, capitalization grant conditions, or the requirements contained in the [EPA BIL SRF Implementation Memo](#) dated March 8, 2022. The BIL supplemental appropriations are federal funds and therefore all equivalency requirements apply to projects funded by BIL.

**The EPA BIL SRF Implementation Memo includes the following other provisions summarized below:**

1. Equivalency: BIL supplemental appropriations are federal funds and therefore all equivalency requirements apply to BIL capitalization grants.
2. Build America, Buy America Act: BIL creates the Build America, Buy America (BABA) Act domestic sourcing requirements for federal financial assistance programs for infrastructure, including the SRF programs. For more specific information on BABA implementation, please refer to the Office of Management and Budget's Build America, Buy America Act Implementation Guidance. EPA will issue a separate memorandum for BABA after the United States Office of Management and Budget (OMB) publishes its guidance. The American Iron and Steel provisions of both the CWSRF and DWSRF continue to apply.
3. Reporting: States must use EPA's SRF Data System to report key BIL project characteristics and milestone information at least quarterly. Additional reporting will be required through the terms and conditions of the grant award. The Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act (FFATA) of 2010 requires SRF programs to report on recipients that received federal dollars in the FFATA Subaward Reporting System ([www.fsrs.gov](http://www.fsrs.gov)).
4. Blending Funds and Cash Draws: States have the flexibility to craft single assistance agreements (e.g. loans) that contain multiple types of construction components and activities. These assistance agreements may commit funds from multiple BIL capitalization grants and base program funds. Upon disbursement of funds, these assistance agreements may draw from both BIL and base SRF capitalization grants for eligible project components.



5. Green Project Reserve: If provided for in the annual appropriation, the Green Project Reserve (GPR) is applicable to the BIL capitalization grants for the corresponding fiscal year.

6. Inter-SRF Transfers: Per SRF statute and regulation, states have the flexibility to transfer funds between the CWSRF and DWSRF. Given BIL's requirements, authorities, and narrower SRF eligibilities, states may only transfer funds between the specific BIL appropriations in the equivalent CWSRF or DWSRF program. In other words, transfer of funds may occur between the CWSRF and DWSRF General BIL capitalization grants and between the CWSRF and DWSRF BIL Emerging Contaminants capitalization grants. Because there is no similar CWSRF appropriation to the DWSRF BIL LSLR appropriation, no funds may be transferred from or to the DWSRF BIL LSLR appropriation. States may not transfer BIL appropriations to or from base appropriations.

- As authorized by Section 302 of the Safe Drinking Water Act the state may transfer up to 33% of the capitalization grant between the two revolving funds (DWRP and WPCRF). The SRF program reserves the right to transfer up to the statutory limit of 33% of the BIL capitalization grants if needed to address the demands on the programs. Based on the lack of demand for WPCRF emerging contaminants funding, and in order to support higher demand for drinking water emerging contaminant funding, the SRF program expects to have completed the transfer of an estimated \$4,149,000 million (sum of 2022-2024 WPCRF BIL emerging contaminants grants) in calendar year 2024. As of the drafting of this IUP, the necessary authority and all required approvals were obtained for the transfer and the program is applying to the EPA to transfer the funds. The transfer is from the WPCRF emerging contaminant fund to the DWRP emerging contaminant fund. The transfer helps balance the program demand so the DWRP can provide more emerging contaminant funding in 2025 and should not impact the overall ability of the SRF program to fund projects in the near or long term or have an impact on drinking water set-asides. No changes to payment schedules or binding commitments are anticipated. SRF stakeholders were notified of the state's intent to transfer funds and a stakeholder meeting was held on June 27, 2024, to discuss the transfer and answer stakeholder comments and questions. Transfers are deposited into the appropriate fund. Based on the statutory language approved by the Colorado State General Assembly in 2002 (ref. CRS 37-95-107.8 and 34-95-107.6), any transfer can be made from one account to the other with appropriate approvals. The SRF program ensures all transferred funds meet the federal compliance requirements including federal crosscutter compliance.

7. Recycled Funds: To the extent assistance recipients repay BIL funds or provide interest payments to the state SRF program, those repaid funds and interest have the

flexibility to be used for any SRF-eligible purpose. For example, repaid DWSRF BIL LSLR funds are not limited to future LSLR projects and activities.

8. Potential State Match Flexibility: To support implementation of the SRF program, the Department of the Treasury has determined that State and Local Financial Recovery Funds under the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) available for the provision of government services, up to the amount of the recipient's reduction in revenue due to the public health emergency, may be used to meet the non-federal match requirements of the DWSRF and CWSRF programs.

9. Federal Civil Rights Responsibilities, Including Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 is reviewed by the state to ensure requirements are met and applies to DWRF and WPCRF programs for both base and BIL funding.
