Colorado FY 2005 Goal: Reduce the percentage of women with inadequate weight gain during pregnancy to 20.0 percent.

Comparisons are based on the Colorado 2005 goal. Data are survey data for 1997-1999, available by State Planning and Management Region, not by county.

Regions categorized as close to the goal are within 20 percent of the goal; regions at some distance from the goal are 21 percent to 49 percent higher than the goal; and regions far from the goal are at least 50 percent higher than the goal.
