

Teen Motor Vehicle Death Rate
State Performance Measure 3

Healthy People 2010 Goal: Reduce the rate of deaths among adolescents age 15-19 caused by motor vehicle crashes to 9.2 deaths per 100,000 teens.

County rates are for 1998-2000 three-year averages.

Counties categorized as close to the goal are within 20 percent of the goal; counties at some distance from the goal are more than 20 percent away but less than double the goal; and counties far from the goal are at least double the desired goal.
