


Infant Mortality Rates National Outcome Measure 1

Healthy People 2010 Goal: *Reduce the infant mortality rate to no more than 4.5 deaths per 1,000 births.*

County rates are 1998-2002 five-year averages, except for Broomfield which is for 2002 only. The state rate is 6.2.

Counties categorized as close to the goal are within 20 percent of the goal; counties at some distance from the goal are more than 20 percent away but less than double the goal; and counties far from the goal are at least double the desired goal.
