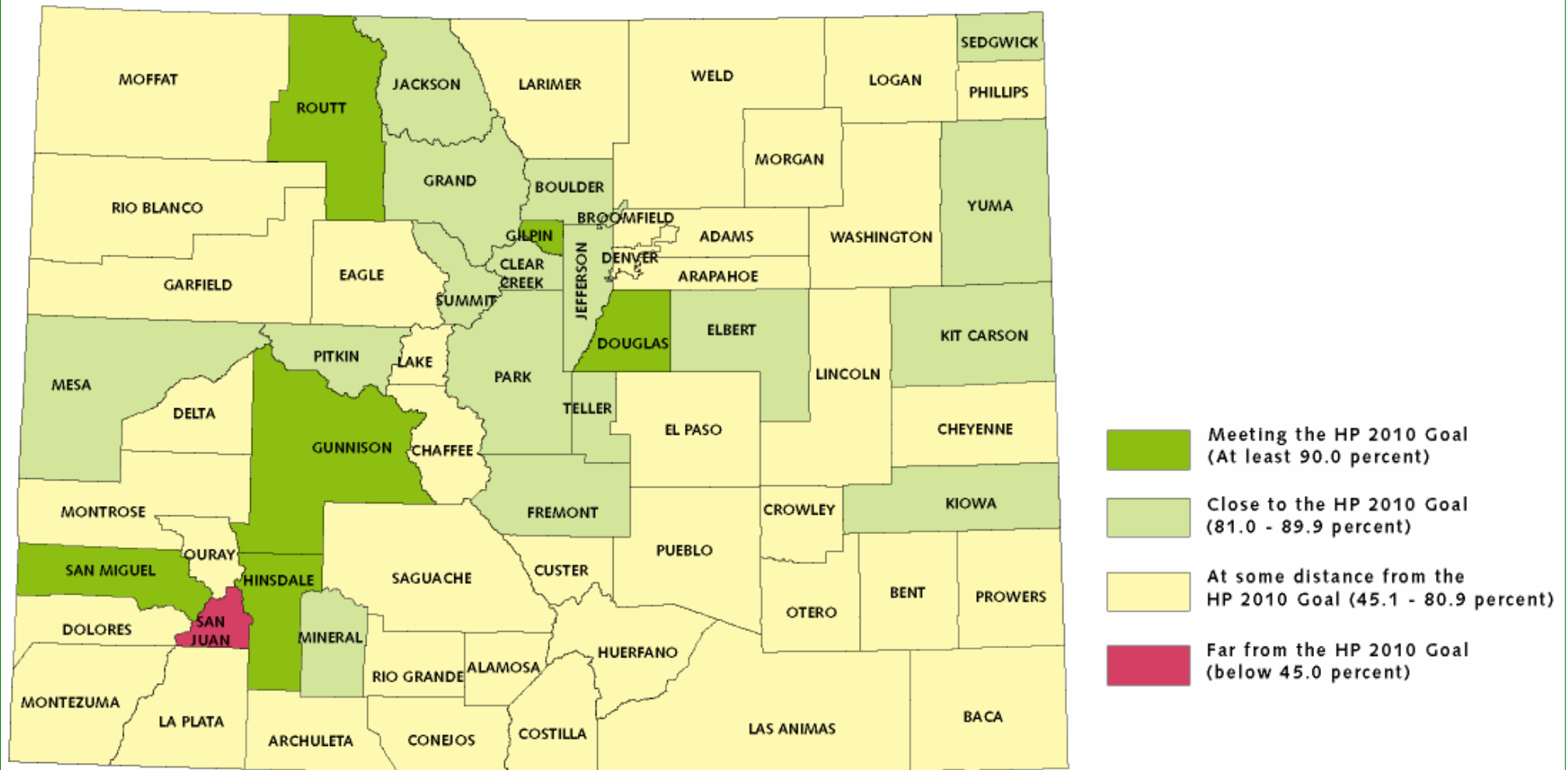


First Trimester Prenatal Care National Performance Measure 18

Healthy People 2010 Goal: *Increase the percent of infants born to pregnant women receiving prenatal care beginning in the first trimester to 90.0 percent.*

County rates are for the year 2003. The state rate is 79.3 percent.

Counties categorized as close to the goal are within 90 percent of the goal; counties at some distance from the goal are between 51 percent and 89 percent of the goal; and counties far from the goal are 50 percent or less of the desired goal.
