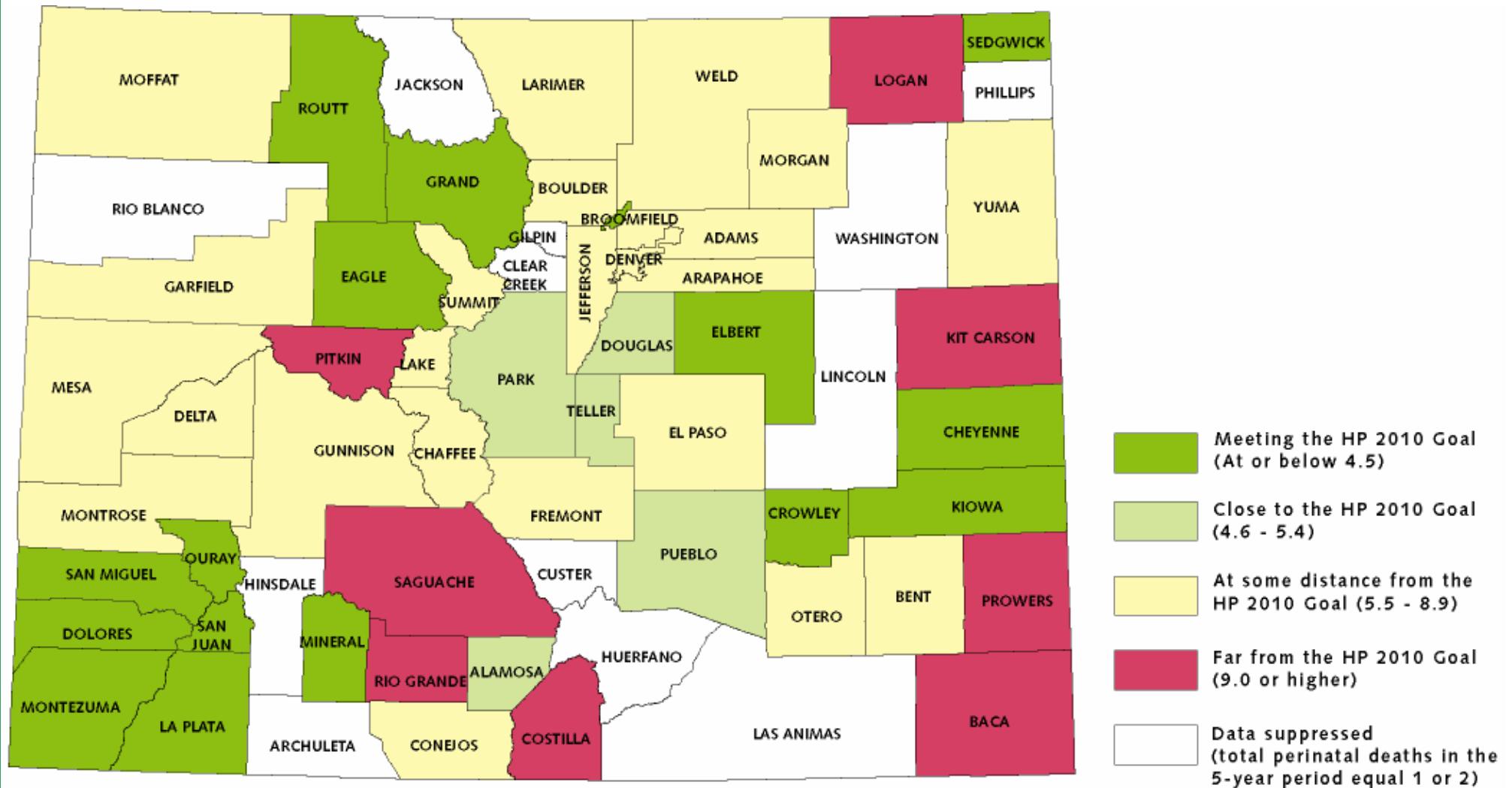


## Perinatal Mortality Rate National Outcome Measure 5

**Healthy People 2010 Goal:** *Reduce the perinatal (neonatal plus fetal) mortality rate to no more than 4.5 deaths per 1,000 births.*

*County rates are 1999-2003 five-year averages, except for Broomfield which is 2002-2003 only. The state rate is 6.5.*

*Counties categorized as close to the goal are within 20 percent of the goal; counties at some distance from the goal are more than 20 percent away but less than double the goal; and counties far from the goal are at least double the desired goal.*
