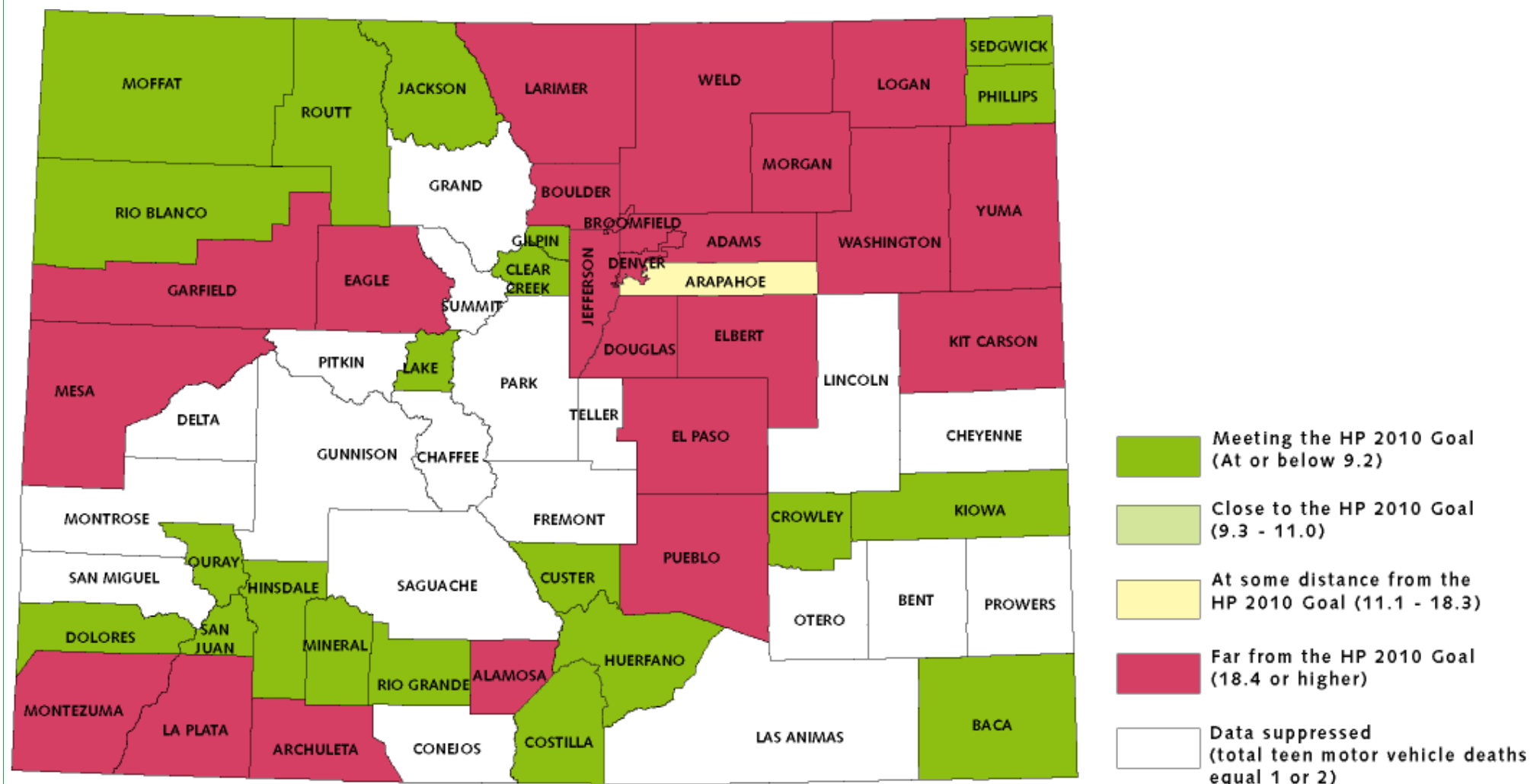


Teen Motor Vehicle Death Rate State Performance Measure 3

Healthy People 2010 Goal: *Reduce the rate of deaths among adolescents age 15-19 caused by motor vehicle crashes to no more than 9.2 deaths per 100,000 teens.*

County rates are 2001-2003 three-year averages, except for Broomfield, which is 2002-2003 only. The state rate is 29.3.

Counties categorized as close to the goal are within 20 percent of the goal; counties at some distance from the goal are more than 20 percent away but less than double the goal; and counties far from the goal are at least double the desired goal.
