
Teen Motor Vehicle Death Rate State Performance Measure 5

Healthy People 2010 Goal: Reduce the rate of deaths among adolescents age 15-19 caused by motor vehicle crashes to no more than 9.2 deaths per 100,000 teens.

County rates are 2002-2004 three-year averages. The state rate is 29.6.

Counties categorized as close to the goal are within 20 percent of the goal; counties at some distance from the goal are more than 20 percent away but less than double the goal; and counties far from the goal are at least double the desired goal.
