
## **Teen Homicide Rate**

Healthy People 2010 Goal: Reduce the homicide rate to no more than 3.0 per 100,000 teens.

County rates are 2000-2004 five-year averages, except for Broomfield which is 2002-2004 only. The state rate is 6.1.

Counties categorized as close to the goal are within 20 percent of the goal; counties at some distance from the goal are more than 20 percent away but less than double the goal; and counties far from the goal are at least double the desired goal.
