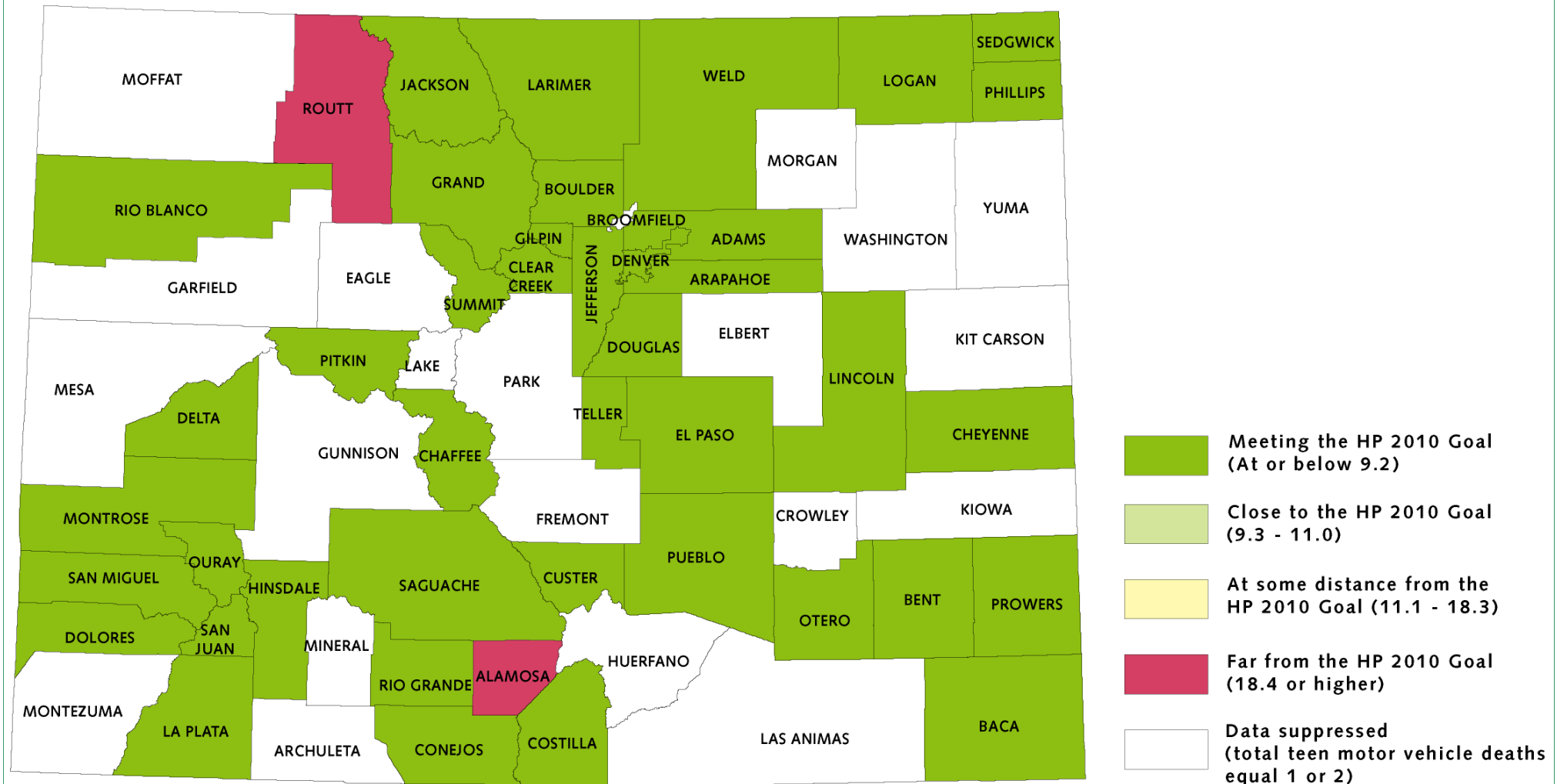


Motor Vehicle Death Rate 0-14 National Performance Measure 10

Healthy People 2010 Goal: *Reduce the rate of deaths to children aged 0-14 caused by motor vehicle crashes to no more than 9.2 deaths per 100,000 children.*

County rates are 2002-2004 three-year averages. The state rate is 4.0.

Counties categorized as close to the goal are within 20 percent of the goal; counties at some distance from the goal are more than 20 percent away but less than double the goal; and counties far from the goal are at least double the desired goal.
